

FOURTH DAY OF
DRIVE BRINGS
TOTAL TO \$3650

\$800 Added To Anti-Tuberculosis Fund In Day—
Christmas Seal Sale Meets Ready Response

Eight hundred dollars was added to the anti-tuberculosis fund through the sale of health bonds and Christmas seals yesterday, bringing the total amount realized from the four days' drive to \$3,650.

Benjamin Rice and J. W. Sadler headed the team which brought in the high score of \$877 yesterday. Team workers under P. C. Paine added \$120 to the fund and \$193 was realized from the booths.

Leaders in the campaign for an anti-tuberculosis fund which to carry on health work in Maricopa county expressed the opinion last night that the goal of \$10,000 originally set would be more than doubled before the drive was brought to a close Christmas eve. Predictions are being freely made among the workers that the original goal will be reached in this the first week of the drive.

"By its active interest and liberal response to this work Phoenix and Maricopa county has indicated an appreciation and desire for a permanent clinic here," was the comment of T. C. Cuvelier, executive secretary of the Arizona Anti-Tuberculosis association. "Encouraged by this attitude of the people here, a special committee, brought together Wednesday night, decided to establish a permanent clinic by the first of January. Part of the money realized from this drive will be devoted to this institution. However, a generous portion of the general fund will be reserved to give the children a real outing next summer. All the money obtained in this campaign will be devoted to bettering conditions in Maricopa county."

Much interest in drive
So great is the interest in this campaign for a worthy home cause that many have called the headquarters at 300 East Adams street to ascertain whether money can be sent direct. Arrangements have been made to receive and credit all donations addressed to the Maricopa Anti-Tuberculosis association, 300 East Adams street, and such money will be turned over to the general fund for which it is designated.

The arrangement has been made because of the impossibility of reaching all the people who desire to contribute through personal solicitation. This was illustrated by a woman who brought \$10 to the headquarters yesterday. She said she had the money ready, expecting one of the canvassers to call. When she returned home from a trip to the city yesterday she was informed by her maid that the campaign worker had made the visit. She immediately took the envelope containing the \$10 she had laid aside direct to 300 East Adams street.

"These workers are good enough to donate their services," she declared, "and it would be very unjust of me to expect them to make a second call at my home."

More volunteer workers are needed. There is work to be done at headquarters which only requires a short time in the evening.

The Council of Jewish Women will be in charge of the booth at the post-office today; Daughters of the King (of Trinity Pro-Cathedral) will have charge of the Central pharmacy booth, and the Woman's club the booth at Goldwater's.
