

### URGES OIL REFINERS AND USERS' MEET TO RELIEVE SHORTAGE

WASHINGTON, June 19.—The calling of a conference of the leading oil refiners and of representatives of the principal fuel oil using industries as a means of working out some distribution plan that would insure a reasonable supply of oil was suggested today by Secretary of Commerce Alexander in a letter to Senator Phelan of California.

Secretary Alexander in replying, said that although until formal proclamation of peace, the president had authority to restrict the export of commodities, an embargo to relieve the Pacific coast situation would have to be applied under the law to all American ports. An oil export embargo, Mr. Alexander further asserted, would result in general injury to American prestige in foreign countries. The best solution, he declared, would be a conference between refiners and industrial consumers.
