An insight into the hardships experienced by the soldiers who patrolled the Arizona frontiers of civilization is given in the following letter from Jacob Youtley of Kevin. He is native of Pennsylvania, born in Rockburgh, Somerset county, in 1847. It was in November, 1866, that Mr. Youtley enlisted in the regular army at Johnston, Va.
