A LOAN OF \$25,000,000.

Taken in New York by the Russian Government. New York, Feb. 28--Ignoring Berlin, London, Paris and the other European banking centers, the Russian government has come to New York for a loan. A syndicate of financial institutions of this city--banks, trust companies and insurance companies--have just arranged the purchase of \$25,000,000 of 4 per cent. bonds, representing a first mortgage on the Vladikavkas railway system. The principal and interest of these bonds is guaranteed by the Russian government. The first \$10,000,000 of the bonds have just been delivered in New York, and a payment of \$5,000,000 has been made on account. All of the cash to be paid by the syndicate for the bonds will remain in this country, and will be disbursed under direction of the Russian fiscal agent in America, M. de Boutkovsky, in payment of the balances which Russia is incurring with American shippers, iron and steel manufacturers and others of that class. Russian purchases in this country amount to between \$8,000,000 and \$10,000,000 annually.
