FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL

MARKET WAS IRREGULAR New York, May 4.—Trading in stocks today was very active at irregular prices. Dealers were more competitive than usual, although oil and petroleum stocks bulked large in the operations of the day.

Incidentally, the day marked the 25th anniversary of the full season in which transactions on the million share line, sales aggregating 1,400,000 shares.

The money market and general industrial conditions were helpful factors in the main. Call loans eased with the progress of the season, opening at 4-1/2 per cent, but dropping to four per cent at mid-day.

Technical conditions seemed to prompt an extension of the profit-taking movement, but it was not the main factor in the selling assumed formidable dimensions. Reactions of 1-1/2 points were secured on offerings of steel, motors, securities and some of the oil.

Pressure was most clearly reflected in Republic Iron, Studebaker, Baldwin, Mexican Petroleum, Texas company and Standard Oil of California, these closing at a net loss of large fractions to 1-1/2 points.

On the other hand, Brooklyn Rapid Transit, which featured the day's lively trading in local issues, closed at a net gain of 3-1/4 points and Kelley-Springfield, Standard Oil of New Jersey and Houston Oil were materially higher.

Stocks were better, some at least, any time since the question of lower freight rates became a debatable question, their absorption being attended by more favorable reactions than in the past. In that group, however, gains were more or less impaired by the late reaction.

Passing of the so-called "crisis" at Geneva was followed by a net gain of 1/2 point in sterling exchange and pronouncedly throughout the continental list. Swiss francs were the only exception, closing six points below par for the first time in several months.

South American rates made no response to the successful offering of the Brazilian coffee loan.
