ALD. PAONESSA OPENS CAMPAIGN

Democrat Nominee Addresses Women's Mass Meeting

A week of political activity opened last night when Alderman Angelo M. Paonessa, candidate on the democratic ticket for the office of mayor, appeared before a meeting of the democrat women's auxiliary in K. of C. hall to discuss campaign issues.

Given Ovation The democrat candidate was given an ovation upon his appearance in the hall by several hundred women supporters who turned out to greet him in his first address as the party's nominee.

Alderman Paonessa instructed the women in the operation of city governmental matters. He discussed the organization of commissions and boards and the work entrusted to each. The speaker discussed the municipal developments of recent

years as well as those projected to take place in the near future.

Women For Commissions In asking for the support of the women voters, the candidate assured the gathering that places on commissions will be given women whenever it is felt that they can properly fill the jobs, if he is elected mayor. He asserted that he had promised not a single job to anyone, and if elected would go into the office without a string attached to him.

He called attention to his record in the common council as an alderman. He assured that, if he was selected by the voters as the city's next mayor, he would carry on the duties of that office as conscientiously as he did the office of alderman.

Speaks Tonight The candidate will speak at a first ward rally tonight in Turner hall on Arch street. This district, one of the two that gave Mayor Curtis a majority over G. A. Quigley in the republican primary, is looked to for a big turnover in favor of the democrats. Besides the majority candidate, Richard Schaefer, council candidate, and Morley Borien, nominee on the democratic ticket for office of city treasurer, will be heard.

Tomorrow night, Alderman Paonessa and several candidates on the city ticket will speak at a K. of C. meeting hall on Main street. On Thursday evening, the alderman will speak in his own ward, the sixth. Unless present plans are changed, there will be no further meetings until Monday evening when he will again speak at Ukrainian hall, Erwin place. Quigley Also Active

George A. Quigley, the republican nominee, will speak to a men's gathering at republican headquarters next Friday evening. The republican women will be addressed tomorrow night at headquarters, by Mrs. S. O. Prentice of Hartford, chairman of the women's committee of the republican state central committee.

Henry E. Gardiner, the farmer-labor candidate for mayor, spoke to a gathering last night in Koloedny's hall on Arch street. The candidate reports much encouragement during the past several times and from the interest taken in the rallies held, anticipates an unusually heavy farmer-labor vote.

LIPSTICK WAR FOUGHT APRIL 6

Mandamus Against School Will Then Come Up

Corning, Ark., April 4.—The "lipstick" case of Knobel, Ark., in which Miss Pearl Pugsley, 15 year old, seeks a writ of mandamus to set aside rules of the Knobel school board forbidding students to use cosmetics, wear low and peek-a-boo waists and short skirts, is set to come up before Judge W. W. Bandy in Clay county circuit court here April 6.

Miss Pugsley was dismissed from the elementary school at Knobel because she had violated the rules, according to N. E. Hicks, principal. The girl and her friends claim that she had only talcum powder on her face.

Received Letters National notoriety has been given the case, and Miss Pugsley says she has received thousands of letters from all parts of the country and from persons in all walks of life sympathizing with her on the question.

The rules were promulgated by the school board last August at the beginning of the public school term at Knobel, and the case has been called up several times, but each time something has delayed it.

It is reported that the school board will contend that the question is not for the courts to decide, but is solely under the jurisdiction of the board.

REPORT FREE STATE NOT FAVORED HERE

Head of Barry Council Feels City is United on Rejection of England's Proposal

Although there have been differences of opinion openly expressed elsewhere with regard to the political disorders in Ireland caused by the Free State—Republic wrangle, President M. J. Kelly of Commodore Barry council, A. R. I. R., asserted this morning that he has not heard a single voice raised here in opposition to the rejection of the Free State proposal.

Commodore Barry council has gone on record as unqualifiedly in favor of turning down that proposition and all other such proposals that do not embody the fundamentals of a republic. This, the local organization feels, can be brought about without further bloodshed, and it is proposed to exert every effort toward that end.

Rev. Michael O'Flannigan, vice-president of the Sinn Fein, will speak tomorrow evening at the Lyceum theater under the auspices of Barry council. He came to this country from Ireland only a short time ago. The speaker has talked to capacity houses in practically every big city in the east.

Other speakers to be heard are: Peter Golden, a member of the executive board of the A. R. I. R.; Hon. Austin Stack, deputy chief of the Irish Republican Army, and J. J. O'Kelley, a member of the faculty at the University of Ireland.

SOVIET PROPAGANDA

Conferences on With Government Officials Over Lie of Action at Genoa.

Berlin, April 4.—(By the Associated Press)—The Russian soviet delegates to the Genoa conference conferred at length yesterday with German government officials with the object of arriving at an agreement on a common line of action to be followed at Genoa.

Despite the current impression that the Russians are in Germany only in an unofficial capacity while on their way to Italy they are showing alacrity in keeping the official and social appointments made for them.

Yesterday they were entertained at luncheon by Dr. Walter Rathenau, German foreign minister and among those attending were many German industrial, financial and political leaders as well as high government officials.

POLISH ORPHANAGE WILL BE ERECTED

New Stone Structure to Go Up on the Property of Sacred Heart Church on Burrill Street.

Plans for the erection of a new orphanage on the property of the Sacred Heart Polish church on North Burrill street are complete. The T. H. Fardy Construction company of Bridgeport has been awarded the contract for building the place by Rev. Lucyan Bojnowski, who was instrumental in starting the project. The cost of the building will be approximately \$300,000, and work on the excavation will commence Thursday of this week.

The orphanage will be made of brick with ornamental stone trimmings, and there will be ample classrooms for the education of the children. Capacious dining halls, playrooms and a gymnasium will also be included.

The Polish orphanage is maintained largely through the efforts of the Polish Catholics and contributions are voluntarily made by churches of this denomination throughout the country. At present Rev. Bojnowski cares for about 150 orphans, who come from all parts of the country. Many of them are war orphans brought to this country for care. Several of them have been returned to their own country now following the new Polish government.

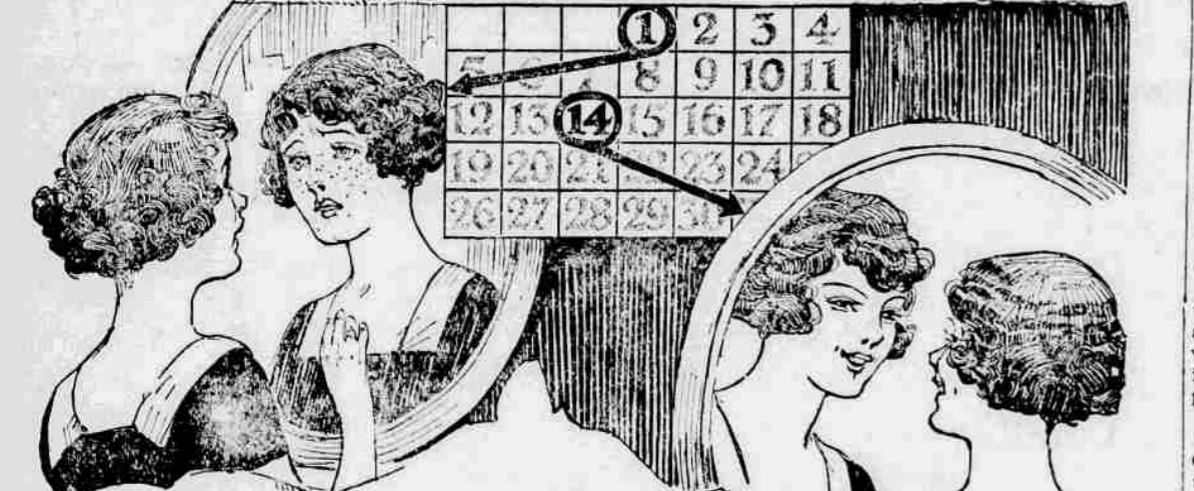
