Jack Clune has assumed the management of Young Moore, a promising featherweight, from Fall River and hopes to get him bouts in this section.

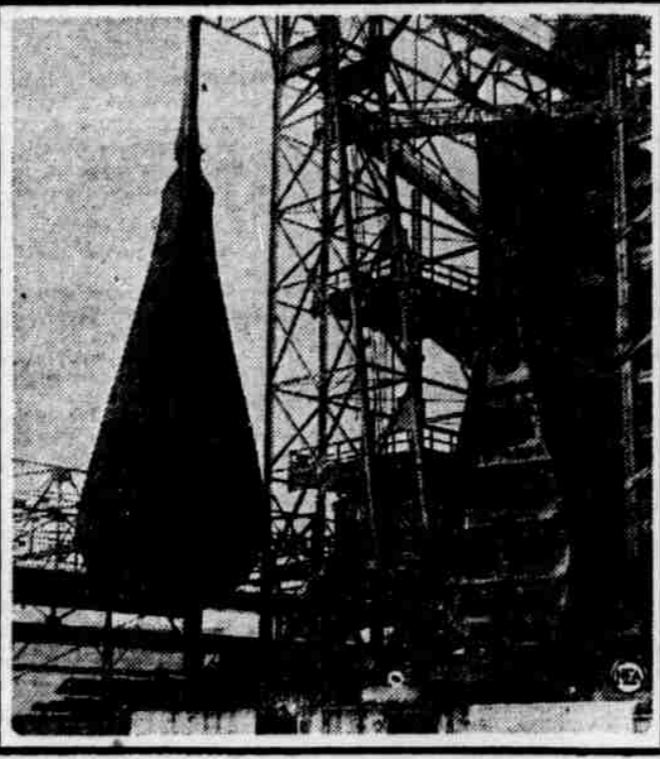
The Ranger football team meets for practice tonight at the corner of Kelsey and East streets.
