HOME ROTE RALLY OF IRISH PATRIOTS IN CARNEGIE HALL

Some 1,000 Irish patriots gathered in Carnegie Hall on Sunday evening for the purpose of adding their voices to the bill from this side of the Atlantic.

Irish patriots in this country have worked unceasingly for more than a quarter of a century to aid the advocates of home rule in their fight for Irish freedom of government.

In an interview last evening Michael E. Corley, president of the Municipal Council of the United Irish League, told of a meeting held recently at the headquarters of the league...

If home-rule meant separation from the British Crown, or something more than that which is enjoyed today in Canada, Australia, and New Zealand, the Irish patriots might with some reason be accused.

In the event of an uprising on the part of the Irish patriots, would the United Irish League send aid to the home rule party, in an effort to restore peace? Mr. Corley was asked.

Hartford, Oct. 2.—The body of Chas. Gilbert, who died at the state prison at Waterbury, after 48 years' confinement for second degree murder, has been turned over to the Yale Medical school, being unclaimed by relatives.

Some time before he died, Gilbert said: "Deliver my body to a medical school when I die and an inspection of my brain will prove my innocence."

The inspection of Gilbert's brain is being looked forward to with great interest. Gilbert was the oldest prisoner at Waterbury at the time of his death.

SHIFT SCHEDULES FOR 1,400 TRAINS

New Haven Road, Fighting Wreck Problem, Makes Wholesale Changes in the Time Table on Sunday.

The New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad has undertaken to meet the problem of protecting the public against any more wrecks by changing the running time of nearly 1,400 trains.

The changes chiefly affect the through trains and the long distance local trains. The time of the limited trains between New York and Boston has been lengthened ten minutes and from five to twenty-three minutes has been added to other through trains between the two cities.

Between Springfield and New York from three to twenty-five minutes have been added to the previous running time of trains. The same principle has been enforced as affecting the time between New York and Pittsfield, and between New York and Boston by way of Waterbury.

One train has been taken off between New York and New Rochelle, one between New Haven and Middletown, one between New Haven and Ansonia, two trains each way between Newport and Fall River and one between Pittsburg and Worcester.
