IN FINANCIAL CIRCLES

New York, March 7.—In the flurry that followed the announcement of the unusual provisions of the sale of \$3,000,000 five-year 5 per cent. notes of the Chesapeake & Ohio, there were some important side lights on the transactions that escaped general notice. The indenture securing the notes, covering the provisions that require the total payment of \$17,000,000 for capital expenditures during the life of the notes before dividends may be paid, states, quoting the letter from the company to the bankers: "No dividends are to be paid or declared on the stock of the company unless its net income after April 1, 1914, shall be in excess of all matured installments of said fund and of the dividends paid for the fiscal year or years immediately subsequent to said date."
