HOUSEHOLD NOTES

Putting wilted vegetables into ice water will restore their freshness.

When washing colored window curtains, use a warm, soapy suds and rinse in lukewarm water. Pour separate waters should be used. If the last water is not absolutely clear, rinse again. Dry out of doors in the shade.

A cotton rug may be cleaned if spread flat on the porch. Hot water should then be poured over it. Rub soap over the entire surface, and scrub with a broom both sides of the rug. Rinse with the garden hose and hang up to dry.

When lining collars, cuffs or belts with lining, or muslin or canvas, it is best to hold the work the right side uppermost, as the work naturally curves over the fingers and causes the upper side to be slightly larger than the under.

Spinach is good served with hard-boiled eggs. The white of the egg is chopped fine and spread over the spinach, and the yolk is forced through a fine sieve and dusted over the white. Add hot vinegar before the egg is put over the spinach.

Bacon will be much sweeter in flavor if it is covered with boiling water and allowed to stand on the back part of the stove for about five minutes. It should then be taken out of the water and laid on a cloth to dry before broiling.

The most important part in house-keeping is the planning. Write down all the tasks that need to be done. Then decide the order of their doing. Perhaps some of the work can be done out of the house. Apportion your work day by day.

In broiling steak or chops the fire sometimes dies down too quickly, when this happens, sprinkle a little granulated sugar over the coal. This intensifies the coals, and the smoke from the sugar will impart to the meat a delicious flavor.

If your blue serge suit wears shabby, renovate it in the following way: Make a very strong blue water, sponge the material with it, allow to dry

slightly, spread on an ironing board, cover with a piece of muslin and press with a hot iron.

When sweeping a room, dust can be prevented from rising by dipping a newspaper in salt water, tearing it up in small pieces and scattering them over the carpet. This not only causes the absorption of the dust, but brightens the color of the carpet.

In stitching seams out on the bias, always begin at the widest end. Keep the garment as flat as possible, and do not let it fall over the edge of the table. This prevents dragging. Also use as small a stitch as the thickness of the material will allow.

When the roast is small, it is best to start it on top of the stove. Heat the pan very hot, put the roast in and turn it frequently, as you would if panning a steak. The quick searing holds the juices in. When it is thoroughly brown all over, place it in a hot oven to finish.

Before you are going to use your paint brushes put them in a strong solution of any of the well-known cleaning powders and soak for ten or twelve hours. Then work out all the paint you can and transfer them to a fresh solution. You will find your best brushes as good as new.

To be sure of sewing fasteners on a blouse in the right position, first sew the smallest part of the fasteners on the top wrap all the way down. Then pin the blouse at the top and bottom and lightly press the top of the fasteners with an iron. This leaves a dent showing the correct position for the other half.

If you want to get your money's worth when using the oven of the gas range, plan a combination of articles, to cook at one time. When you wish to roast a small piece of meat (four or five pounds) you have room for at least two other dishes and shelf space for baking potatoes around the small roasting pan. Dried fruit already soaked, is delicious baked. The combination when baking might be roast meat, potatoes, bread, dried prunes or apricots, or baked apples or brown betty.

THREE STRANGERS IN EVIDENCE AT SIEMON HEARING

Interest at the coroner's hearing in the Siemon-DeMartino case at the court house yesterday was divided between testimony of three witnesses that they saw the body of the deceased barber's supply man hurtling through the air into the shadow of the trees, and the presence at the hearing of three strangers whose identity or purpose has not as yet been learned.

The presence of three strangers was noted from the fact that one of them similarly resembles Carl F. Siemon in face and contour of body. They have been constant attendants at the hearing, and are apparently greatly interested in the testimony given. Though they have excited the interest of reporters and detectives, they have been able to make good their exit from the chambers before they could be approached.

It was whispered about the corridors yesterday that one of the men might be a relative of Siemon, but this fact is discredited by the authorities as well as by those who know Siemon's family. They insist that the resemblance is merely a coincidence.

Miss Alice T. Peterson, who with her father and mother were walking near the scene of the tragedy on the night of October 29, 1910, testified that she heard the noise of the body striking the car, and saw the shadow of the dead man pass from the side of the car to the sidewalk, while the car sped on at a high speed past them. She tried to ascertain the number on the rear of the car, but was unable to do so, for the tail-light was either out or indistinct. Mrs. Peterson saw the body of DeMartino strike the ground and she, as well as Gustave A. Pefer, son, the father, testified that the car did not stop and contained four men.

WILL DECORATE GRAVES OF U. S. SEAMEN ABROAD

Paris, May 28—The graves of several American sailors buried at Cherbourg after the engagement on June 19, 1864, in which the confederate steamer Alabama was sunk by the United States corvette Kearsage, have been located by Hanson Cleveland Cox, American deputy consul general at Paris. These graves, as well as those of several American veterans buried at Versailles and Saint Germain, are to be decorated with flowers and flags by a committee of Americans which has been formed in Paris under the presidency of William S. Dalliba, and of which Mr. Cox is secretary.

SHANNON, VICTIM OF THUGS IN BAD WAY AT HOSPITAL

Conscious and understanding what is said to him but unable to speak, David Shannon, 35 years old of 234 Prospect street, Providence, R. I., is at Bridgeport hospital as a result of an encounter with a highway in the East End freight yards last night. His condition is attracting much attention from local surgeons. On account of his having received a fractured skull in Salt Lake City in October, 1913, an operation is not considered likely now. Shannon wrote that he was born in Helena, Mont., has been connected with the 101 Ranch show and was beating it to Providence when injured. There was \$1.65 taken from his pocket. After regaining consciousness he managed to make his way to Barnum and Seewalk-avenues where he again collapsed.
