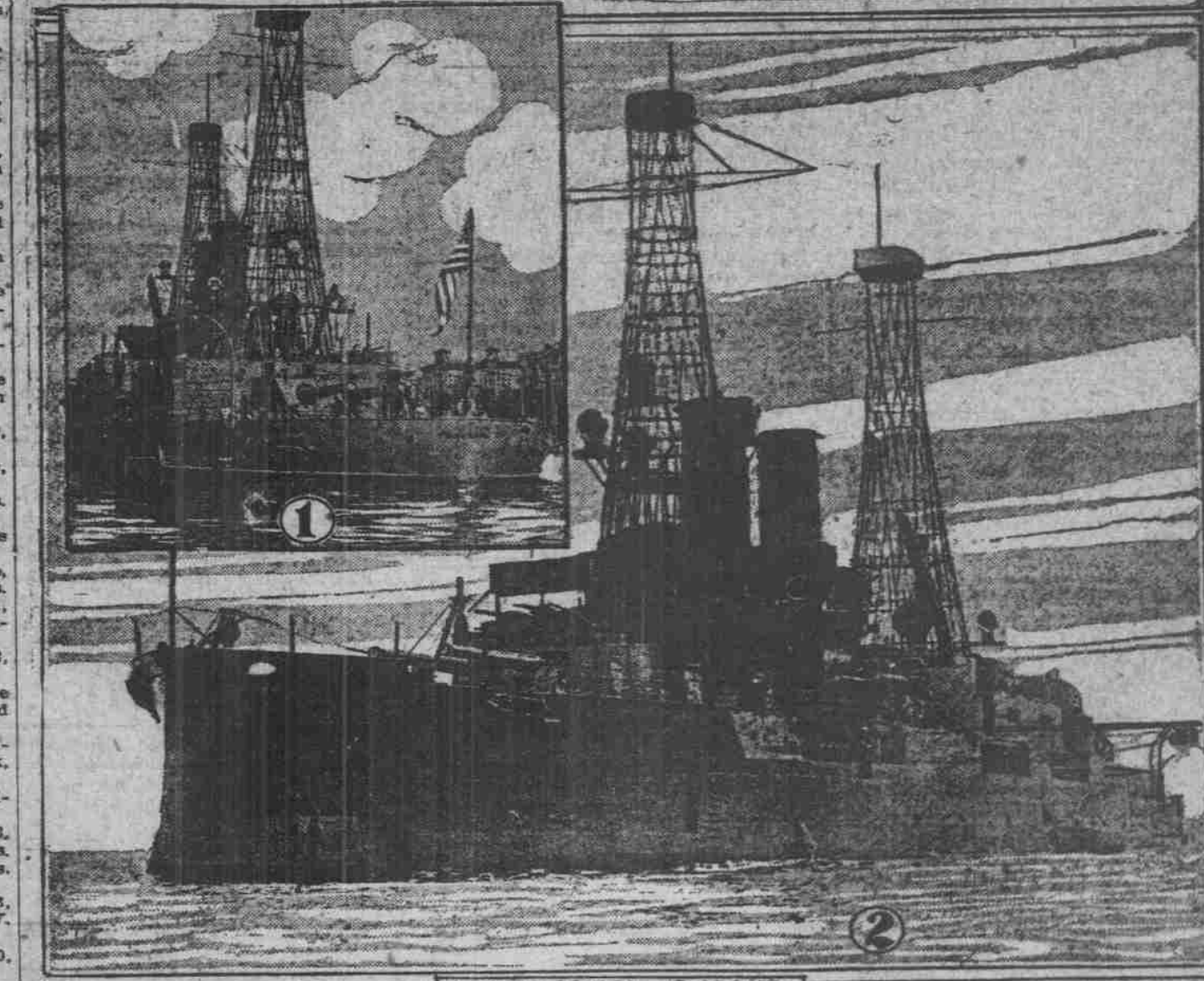
THE AMERICA, "WINGED WHALE," READY FOR TUSSELE WITH FATE IN FLIGHT ACROSS SEA

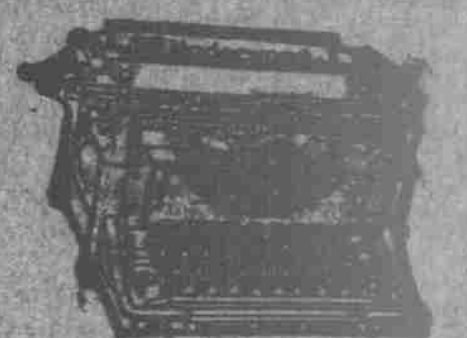
