CANADA IS UNABLE TO PUNISH MATE OF THE STORSTADT

Ottawa, Ont., July 14—Because Third Officer Alfred Turtennes of the collier Storstad, held a Norwegian navigator's certificate, the Canadian Maritime Parliament, it is announced, has found itself unable to inflict any punishment upon him as the man held responsible for the Empress of Ireland disaster.

A report is being sent out to the Norwegian authorities, however, and the Canadian law will be altered so that in the future officers of foreign vessels engaged in the Canadian trade must have Canadian certificates.

Captain Edsall, who commanded the Empress of Ireland, is not likely to go to sea again. It was said here that the Canadian Pacific Railway authorities have given several months' leave of absence to him, and that later he will be assigned to a position ashore, either in Canada or in England.

SCHOOL BOARD IS ASKED TO AID GIRL ALMOST A CRIPPLE

Child Was Injured By Fall of Plaster From High School Ceiling

Local Builder Complains of Out-of-Town Competition In Bidding

Eleven-year-old Ross Hlreshik, 1370 Main street, her right side paralyzed, and rapidly becoming a nervous wreck because of her suffering, appeared before the board of education last night, accompanied by her father, Samuel Hlreshik, a tailor.

The father told of his efforts to obtain the money to cure the girl. Failing, he applied to the board as a last resort. The commissioners asked the father why he waited so long before reporting to the board.

At a meeting of the board next Monday evening, bids for work on the Columbus school will be opened. The complaint of a local builder, received by Commissioner Challenger.
