EXPELLED STUDENT MUST STAY WITHIN THE JAIL LIMITS

Zimmerman Plans to Escape Judgment by Becoming "Poor Debtor"

Joseph Zimmerman, Jr., the Yale student who was sued by Harry Phillips, a trolley car conductor, following a fight on a Norwalk car, was arrested on a body writ this morning. Deputy Sheriff Ladrigan took the young man into custody. It was charged that he had failed to satisfy the judgment for \$275 obtained against him two months ago by Phillips in the common pleas court.

Zimmerman heard the body writ had been issued and he came to this city in company with Frank Huntington, a Norwalk garage proprietor. The party went to the jail where there was a conference between Judge John J. Walsh, representing Zimmerman, and Attorney Leo Davis, appearing for the conductor.

A bond of \$500 was deposited by Huntington and Zimmerman was released. He will be required to stay within the jail limits, however. It was claimed that Zimmerman and another student created a disturbance on a trolley car while they were intoxicated and during the brawl they assaulted the crew of the car. Zimmerman is the son of a wealthy New York business man.

It is Zimmerman's plan to take the poor debtor's oath thus escaping the satisfying of the court's judgment.

TOWN MEETING TONIGHT
The special town meeting to take up the matter of improving the Washington school on North avenue will be held in the town hall this evening and indications are that it will be a well attended and "lively" meeting.

There are two propositions which will be taken up in this matter of an improved school for North avenue. The first proposition will be to erect a four room brick building on the site of Washington school, moving the present frame building back. The grounds around the school would then be drained, the total cost of this proposition being placed at \$23,000.

The second proposition to be placed before the voters is that the sum of \$40,000 be appropriated for the purpose of building an eight room brick building, moving the present frame building back and draining the grounds around the school.

The matter of rescinding the vote taken at a recent town meeting in regard to the purchase of a lot on Hillside avenue will be taken up at the meeting this evening. It was voted at the recent meeting to condemn the lot, paying \$300 for it. It is now proposed to pay \$400 for the lot without going through the condemnation proceedings.

The advisability of straightening the line of Nichols avenue in front of the John Booth estate and the matter of re-releasing the third floor of the town building to the Odd Fellows for a term of five years will also come before the meeting this evening.

MINE DEATH TOLL FROM EXPLOSION NOW PUT AT 115

Pittsburgh, April 25—Rescue parties working in the Cincinnati mine of the Pittsburgh Coal company where an explosion occurred, Wednesday afternoon, this morning, brought 23 additional bodies to the mouth of the mine. Ten additional names were added to the missing. The complete loss of life is placed by those at the mine at 115.

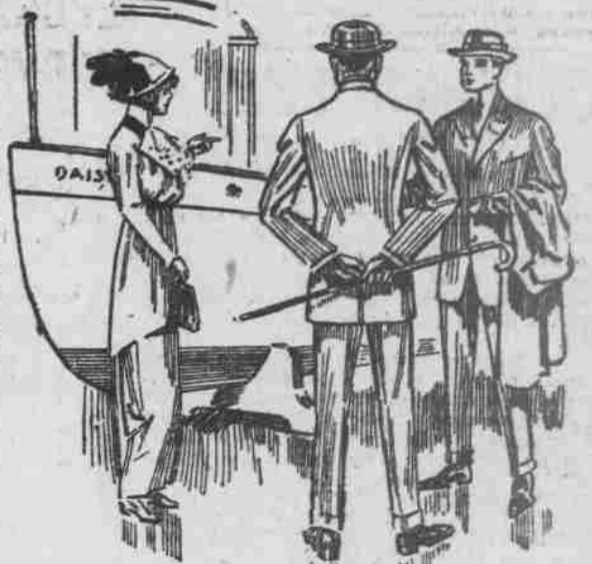
The bodies recovered were found buried under the fallen roof and until the debris has been searched, which will occupy several days, the exact extent of the loss cannot be determined.

The force of workers was increased, this morning, by volunteers from the district but some parts of the mine are still filled with gas and no complete exploration can be made.

Many of the bodies recovered were so mangled that it was feared they never can be identified.

Preparations for those widowed and orphaned by the explosion are under way, and for the present they are being looked after by the Coal company.
