EFFORTS TO BRING ABOUT A WORLD'S WELTERWEIGHT BOUT

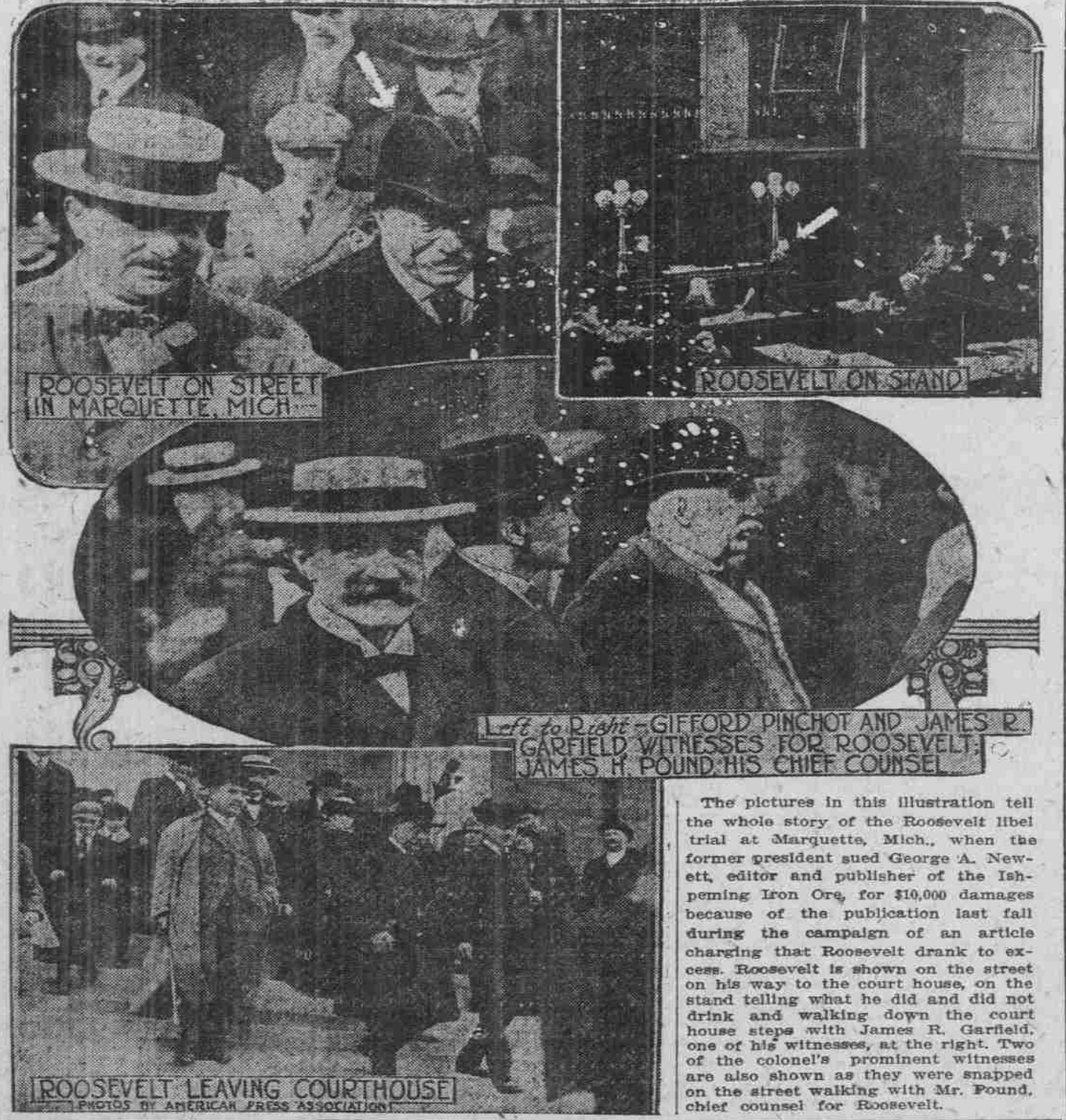
