James Pelletier of New Hartford, one of an automobile touring party, was run down by the machine on the Goshen road on Saturday night and got a broken arm. Having lost his hat he went back after it and the chauffeur backed the machine to pick up his companion, but knocked him down first and picked him up afterwards and brought him to Torrington where the broken bone was set.
