

GROUP OF PROMINENT CITIZENS INSPECTING CONVICT SHIP, SUCCESS, NOW IN HARBOR AT LOWER BRIDGE



Capt. D. H. Smith of the Convict ship Success announced today that more people had visited the ship during her first two days in Bridgeport than had visited her in any other American cities in the same period of time. This would go to show that this grim record of England's penal system and of 18th century ship building has lost none of her novelty but is rather growing as an attraction in American waters. One bears on every hand from those who have visited the ship of the deep in the harbor for the low decks of gloomy and forbidding dungeon and

cells, her gruesome black holes and condemned cells each one a veritable torture chamber. The collection of instruments of torture and restraint shown on board together with a large number of authentic government documents relating to the British criminal system is unique. The signatures of the kings and queens of England for the past 500 years can be seen attached to pardons, orders and death warrants and it is amazing to be made to realize so clearly how simple was the matter for which the sentence of death was passed in those days.
