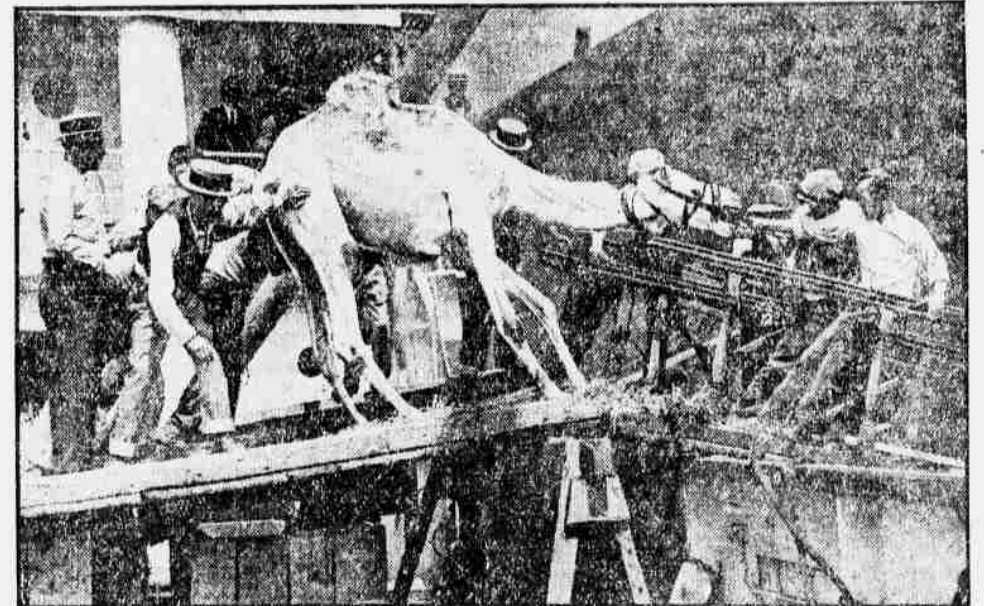

Now Actress



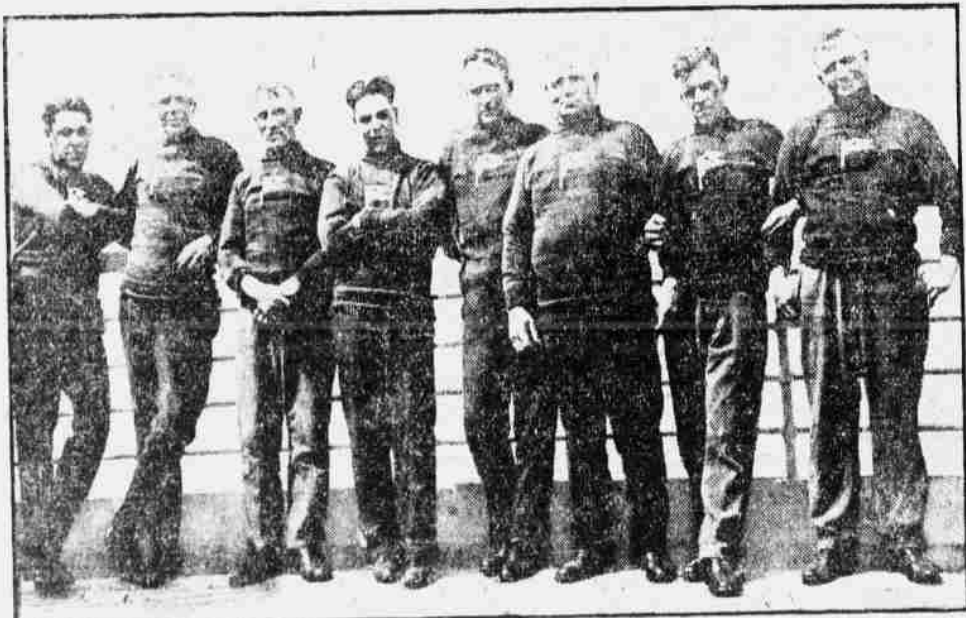

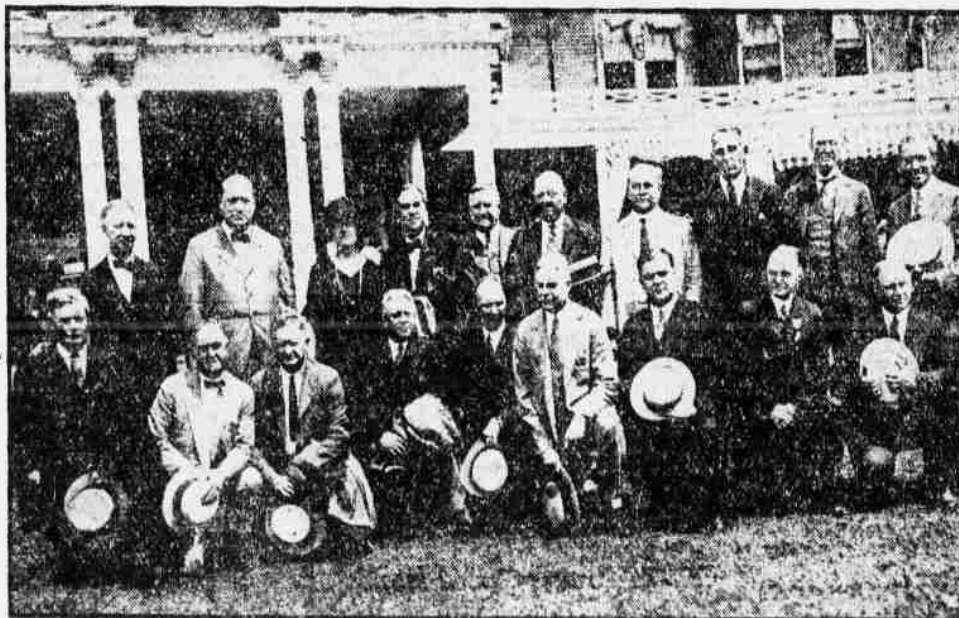

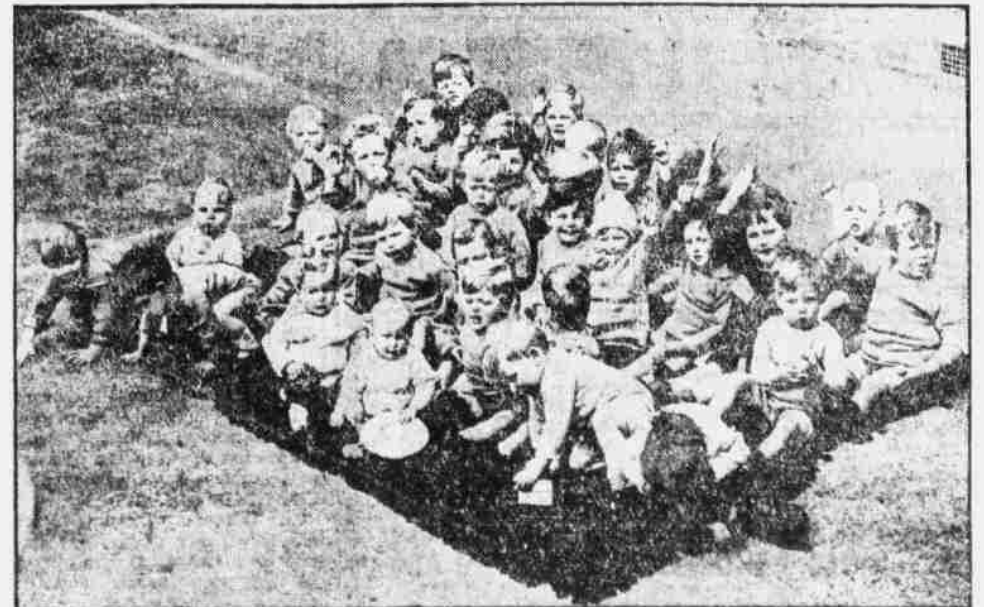
