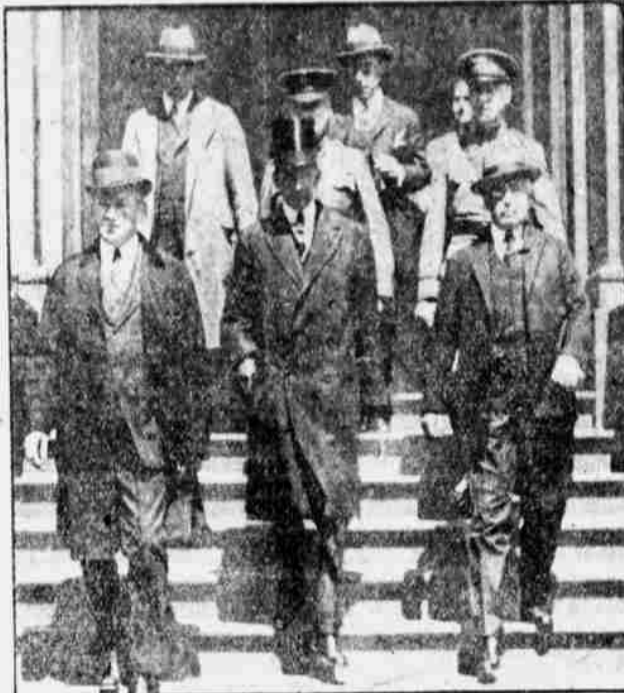
Photo shows Miss Eleanor Wheeler, with Gallantry, which will be entrant in Capital Horse Show, Washington, D. C., May 23-25.

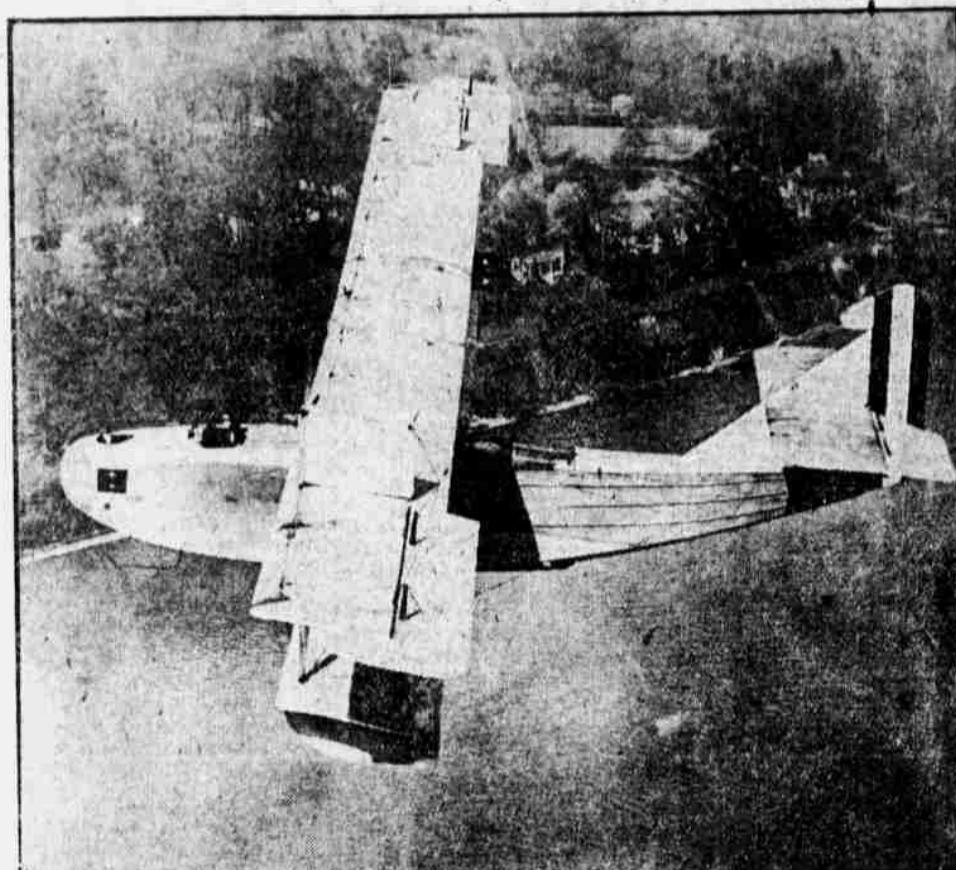
The Peter Pan effect is seen on girdle and the upper sleeves of this chic new spring gown. It is of pretty flowered crepe with plain satin border.

Ex-Mayoress



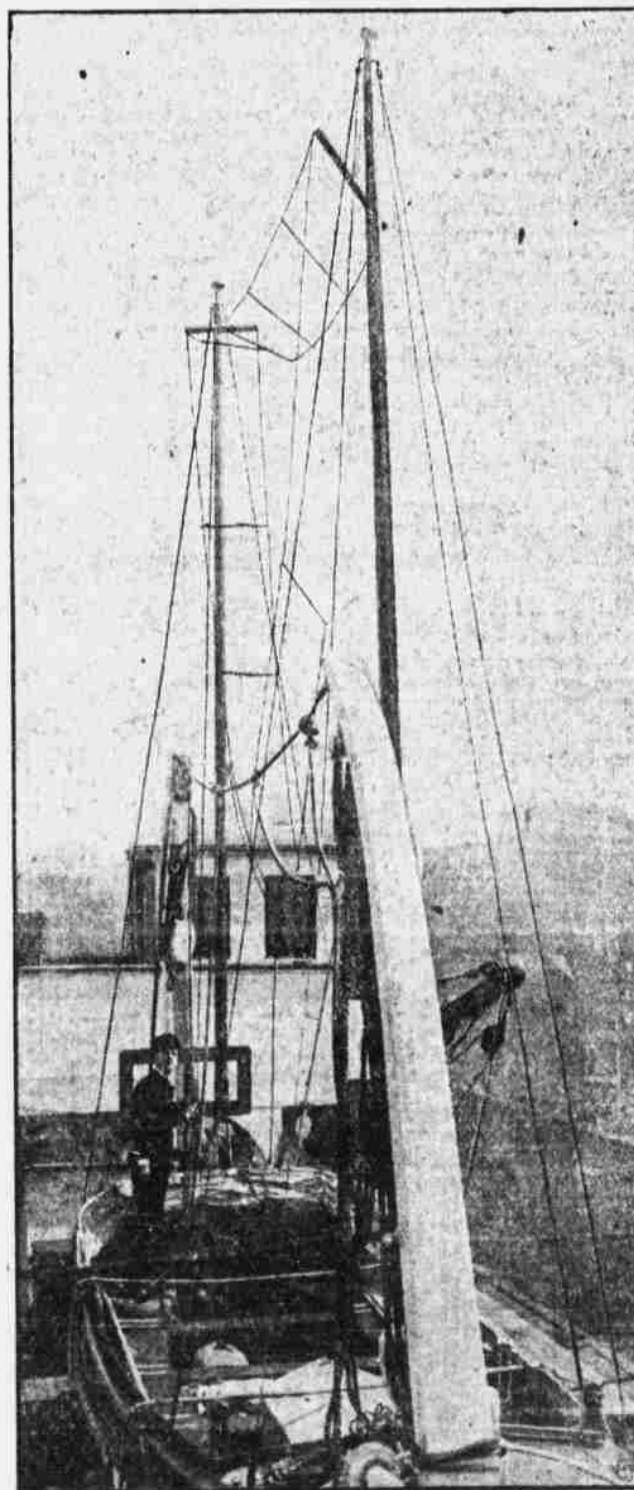
An arrival in New York on the Mauretania was Mrs. H. Currier-Briggs, ex-mayoress of Leeds.

Swim Included in Cross-Country Run



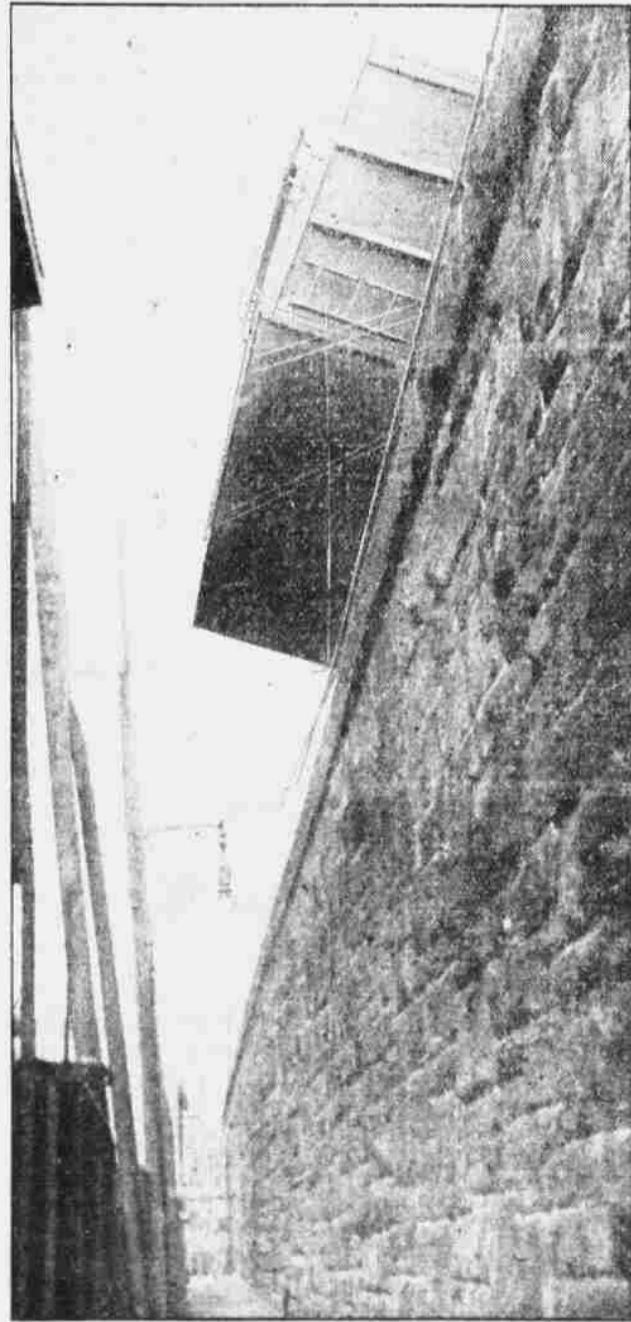
Runners of Bradford college, England, in recent cross-country race were forced to cross the River Pang near Thame. Photo shows crossing.
