MONUMENTS FOR SOLDIERS.

Contractor Maslen Will Set About 100 More Before Frost Sets In.

Contractor Maslen, who has the contract from the state for erecting headstones at soldiers' graves all over the state, is hustling to get about 100 now on hand set before cold weather sets in, says the Courant.

Previous to 1881, under the old law, headstones were made of metal and were furnished by the Monumental Bronze company of Bridgeport.

The receiving of applications, issuing of orders for the stones, and keeping records thereof, takes up much of the time of M. J. Wise, clerk in the quartermaster-general's office.

An amusing incident occurred recently when an old soldier walked into the quartermaster-general's office and said that while talking through Evergreen cemetery, New Haven, he had seen there a headstone erected to his memory.

The people in New Haven had got those soldiers mixed up when they made application for a headstone, and of course the quartermaster-general and clerks had no way of determining which man of that name was dead.

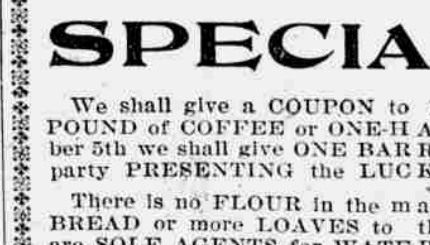

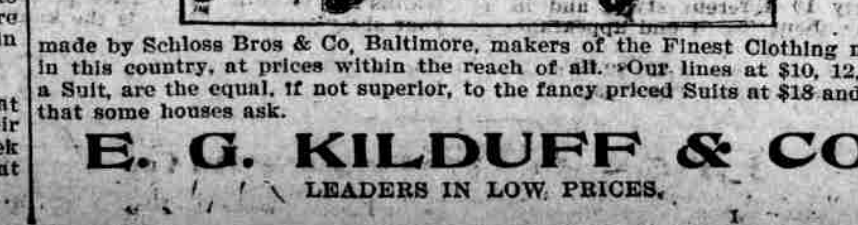
