Notice to Stockholders of Imperial Water Company No. 5

A stockholders meeting is hereby called to meet at Holtville, at 10 o'clock a. m. on Wednesday, Dec. 14, 1904, to consider the following proposition and any others that may appear: At the No. 5 Heading, which is located about three miles southeast of Holtville, a dam was originally put across the Alamo river to raise the water high enough to flow out through the No. 5 Main canal. Two waste ways have been constructed in connection with dam to dispose of the excess water sent down the Alamo river. Both of these structures have been washed away.

Last June a dam was built across the gorge that was made when the structures went out. But there is no waste way to take care of the excess water that may come down the Alamo river. No. 5 Main canal system cannot take care of more than fifteen thousand inches of water. All of No. 5 canal system is in danger every day; the danger increases as the season of high water approaches. No. 5 has a contract with the California Development Company whereby it must build and maintain a suitable waste way at that place. The question is now before us, viz; shall No. 5 go ahead and build that waste way, and take the cost out of the assessment money due January 1, or shall we depend on the slow methods employed by the California Development Company? Webb Was Acquitted

Frank M. Webb was tried Wednesday before Justice of the Peace W. M. Orrick of Silsbee, for horse stealing. The offense was alleged to have been committed over three years ago and a large number of witnesses from both sides of the mountains were present. The defendant was acquitted. Attorney Shepherd represented the prisoner. A touching incident regarding faithfulness to duty is told in connection with the trial. An old Indian living in the mountain pass near the border line, some sixty miles away, was subpoenaed as a witness for the State. He started from home in ample time on a burro, but on the way the animal gave out, and in order to be there, the old man trudged the rest of the weary miles across a waterless desert to the place of trial, on foot, and tired out as he was—came striding into Silsbee fifteen minutes before the case was called.

Coachella Scores One Point

I. W. Gleason left Thursday for his home in Riverside. This will be his first trip to that place since October 23, when he left for the Imperial Valley, expecting to be gone but a short time. During this time Mr. Gleason has seeded 200 acres of his ranch on the line of the Holtville Railroad, to grain. At the beginning of the season this land was offered free for the use of a party who intended planting canteloupes on a large scale. The Coachella Valley people, who are the pioneers of this industry in this section learned of this and induced the canteloupe grower to locate among them.
