

FIGHTING WITH GLOVES.

Two Brutes Found Each Other Until Stopped. New York, Feb. 9.—There was a very private and select prize-fight up town last night and early this morning. Jim Connolly and Jack McConnell were the pugilists and they fought each other until they were tired.

At 1:30 Mr. McCann called time, and Connolly and McConnell stepped to the center of the ring, with their seconds attending to them. The pugilists put up their fists. From the first exchange they fought like madmen all over the ring, landing terrific blows.

The men came up gamely for the third round, and were hardly at the scratch before they went at it again, giving and receiving tremendous right and left hand blows on the nose, mouth, ears and chest.

When the referee called for the fourth round they faced each other determinedly, but both were weak. Neither seemed to have an advantage in the give and take that followed.

They came up again at the call of the fifth round, but so dispirited and exhausted that the referee stepped into the center of the ring and ordered the fight stopped.

Summary of Proceedings in Senate and House. WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—In the United States Senate today Mr. Jones of Nevada, from the Committee on Commerce, reported favorably the bill to relieve vessels from the payment of compulsory pilot fees.

Mr. Logan presented a report on the Select Committee on Ordinance, which was ordered printed. Mr. Edmunds, from the Committee on Foreign Relations, reported favorably the joint resolution for the termination of the fishery treaty with Great Britain.

Mr. Hale, from the Committee on Appropriations, reported the Naval Appropriation bill. He said "the committee had struck from the bill every particle of general legislation, and had put in none of its own."

Mr. Belford of Colorado, from the Committee on Coinage, reported the resolutions declaring it inexpedient to discontinue the coinage of the silver dollar, and recommending that additional vaults be provided for the storage of the accumulated coins at some point in the Mississippi Valley.

Mr. Cannon of Iowa, offered a resolution providing that during the session of the session it shall be in order on any day after the morning hour to move to suspend the rules, so as to consider in the House any regular appropriation or revenue bill which shall have been reported to the committee and may then be in Committee of the Whole on the State of the Union, or which may then be on the Speaker's table, and such motion shall be decided by a majority vote.

The Naval Appropriation bill as reported in the Senate, appropriates \$15,727,434, or \$318,695 more than the bill as passed by the House.

MORNING SUMMARY.

The loss of stock by the storms and cold weather in Colorado is estimated at 15 per cent. B. J. Grier and William Gordon were killed yesterday by the bursting of a boiler at the former's saw mill in Charlotte, Michigan.

Three large rubber factories in New Brunswick, N. J., will close to-day, because of the scarcity of gum. This will throw 3,000 persons out of work. An unknown disease is reported to be causing great havoc among the horses in the Indian Territory. The affected animals "fall dead without warning."

By an explosion of dynamite cartridges in a new railroad cut near Lewisburg, Pa., yesterday morning, Jacob Hempfield was killed and Wesley Machmen dangerously injured. Louis Umberog, 40 years of age, committed suicide in Morristown, N. J., on Thursday night, by fastening a rope around his neck and jumping from a second-story window.

A material train on the Charlotte and Savannah railroad was thrown from the track on Thursday night by a cow. James Johnson and Andrew Jenkins, brakemen, were killed. Milton J. Youberry, convicted of the murder of Charles S. Campbell, was hanged yesterday, at Albuquerque, New Mexico. He harangued the crowd from the scaffold for half an hour.

The small steamer Gem, from Seattle, Washington Territory, was burned near Port Madison yesterday morning, and five persons perished, namely, three boat hands and a passenger named Vickery and his wife. The revenue cutter Grand arrived at Newport yesterday morning, after a fruitless search for the missing steamer State of Georgia, which was supplied with a pilot several days ago about 200 miles east of Block Island.

Thomas Wiggins, colored, finding his wife, from whom he had separated, in company with a colored preacher at Chattanooga, yesterday, he cut her throat with a razor and then cut his own. Both were mortally wounded. The boiler of a tile factory in Taylorville, Ill., exploded yesterday morning, killing five men, namely: Peter New, the proprietor; John McCullum and Wm. Diehl. Two others were fatally injured. The town was shaken "as though it were an earthquake."

Two robbers broke into the house of William McGraw, near Rockford, Illinois, on Thursday night, shot him and his ten-year-old daughter, gagged the wife and robbed them of a small sum of money. McGraw and his daughter are not expected to live.
