A STEAMSHIP BURNED—THIRTY-FIVE PERSONS LOSE THEIR LIVES. COPENHAGEN, Oct. 4. The Swedish steamer S. J. Jager, running between Lubeck and Copenhagen, has been burned in the Baltic Sea, and twenty-four passengers and eleven of the crew perished.

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ENGLAND'S CHINESE DIFFICULTY.

DIPLOMATIC MOVEMENTS AT PEKIN—THE TROUBLE PROBABLY NOT SETTLED. LONDON, Oct. 4. It is reported that Mr. Grosvenor, the second Secretary to the legation, will go to England with despatches. Details are unknown but it is not believed that a final settlement has been reached.
