[From our Late Editions of Yesterday.] Excitement in the Coal Regions. REVIVAL OF THE KING OF VIOLENCE—YOUR MURDER, THE MURDER. Associated Press Special Telegrams. PORTSMOUTH, Pa., Dec. 10. Despatches received from Mahanoy City and Gilberton, this morning, state that there is much excitement in that vicinity in consequence of two dreadful murders committed at two points here this morning by a party of masked men who entered the house of Chas. O'Donnell, seizing and binding him back of the house, where he was shot dead.

A man named McAllister was also taken from his house and shot. A later dispatch states that a sister of McAllister was also murdered.
