The extension of the Wilmington & Western Railroad from Landenberg to Oxford, has been at all times an essential part of the enterprise.

The connections formed at Landenberg with the Panna, Delaware road, and over it, with the Baltimore Central, and Pennsylvania, must be important and valuable, when put into operation.

Now, the extension to Oxford is a comparatively easy matter. The routes surveyed for it are found practicable, and a road can be run at very moderate expense.
