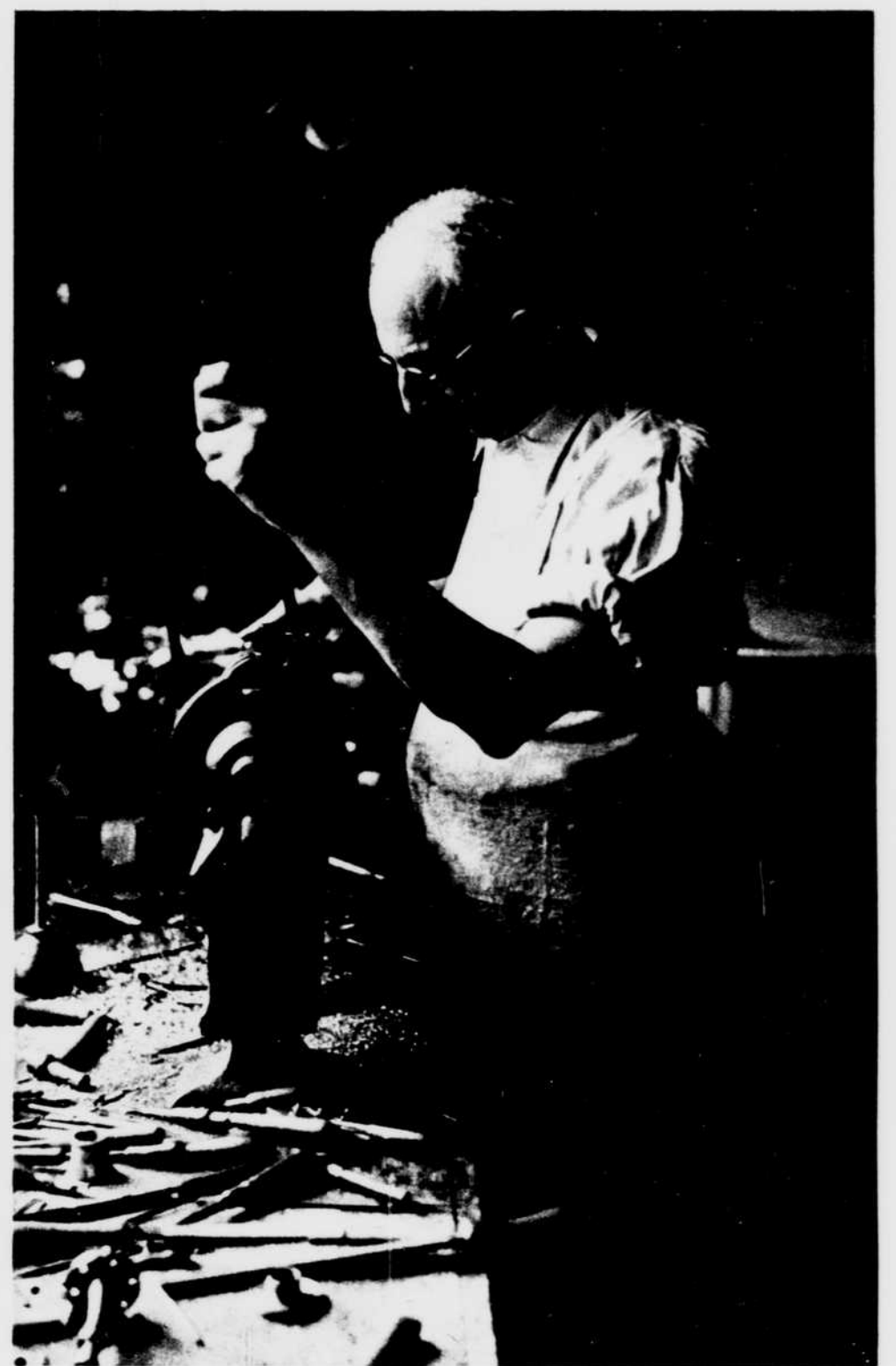




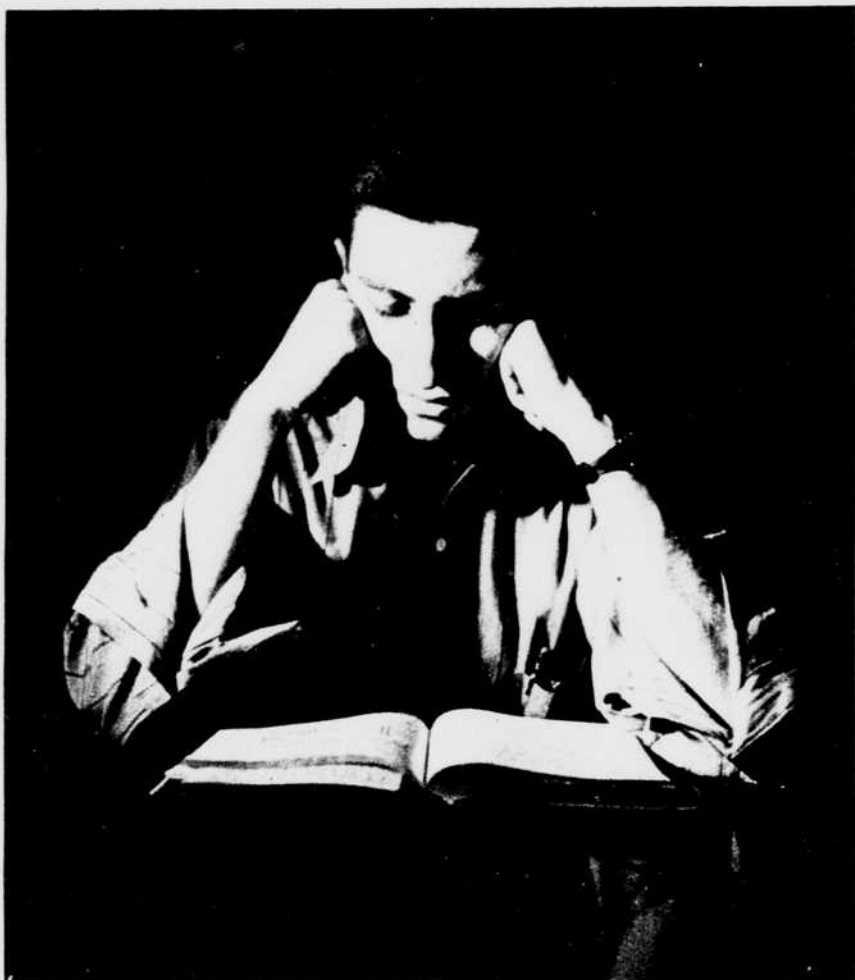
Best Snapshots of first week in The Star's Amateur Contest
