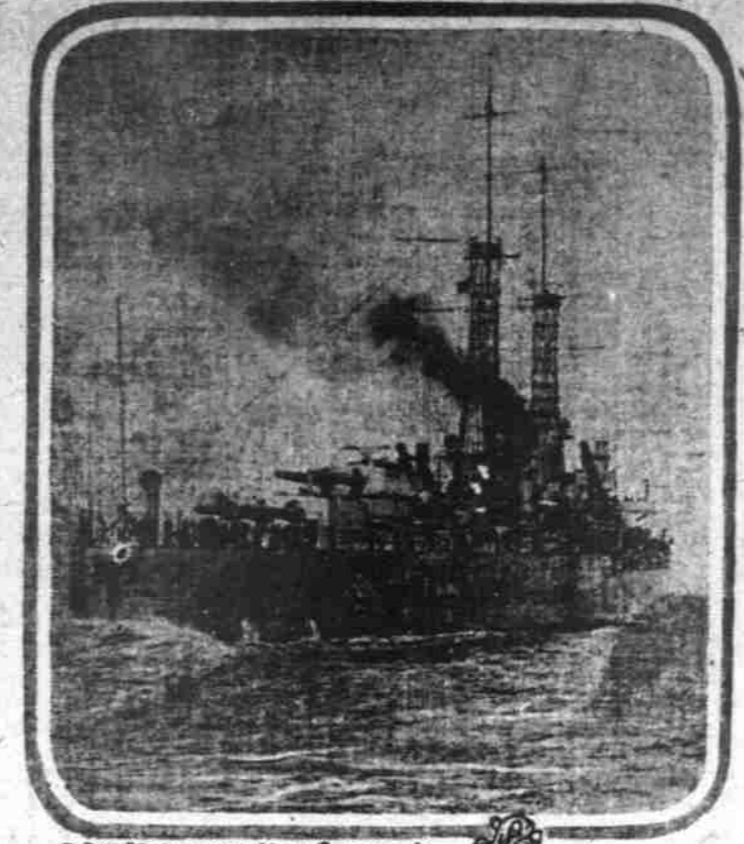

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GIVES PLAN TO INVAD BRITAIN

Easily Possible, Says German General, and Then Tells How.

MUST WIN FRENCH PORTS

Big Guns, Zeppelins, and Mines Then Could Be Used with Success.

Berlin (via Amsterdam), Oct. 27.—"An invading army would be possible easily," is the statement made by a German general in the current issue of the Raxon State Gazette. The article shows that Germany has planned to carry the fight into England after capturing the French coast and ports as far south as the Seine.

The English watch on our naval stations in the neighborhood of Hologland is almost impossible now," he says. "It will be quite impossible when the Belgian coast and the north coast of France to the mouth of the Seine are in German hands."

Philadelphia, Oct. 27.—All of the fierce objection to unjust oppression, which capital, with unpracticed tongue, has tried for years to voice in meetings and groans and stifled cries, was uttered finally to all the world today in an epic defense of the United States Steel Corporation offered before the United States Court of Appeals here by David A. Reed of Pittsburgh.

He cut into the Gary diners and ended with a long quotation from former President Taft to show that the steel corporation is innocent of wrong.
