

### COPS TRAP AVENGER OF MONK EASTMAN

Alleged Bandit Who Held Up Saloon Here for \$2,000 Is Caught in Philadelphia.

### OTHER CRIMES ALLEGED

Opium Layout, Burglar's Utensils, Weapons and Draped Photo of Monk Found.

The man who, according to the police, has constituted himself the avenger of the murder of his pal, the gangster Monk Eastman, was arrested yesterday in Philadelphia. He is Edward Herberger, one time pugilist of Albany, and is also known as Schaeffer, O'Keefe, Williams and Green.

His picture was identified by Joseph Germanhauer, proprietor of the Court Cafe, Broadway and Driggs avenue, Brooklyn, as that of the bandit who held up Germanhauer and four others in the cafe a week ago yesterday and robbed them of \$2,000. Before exposing his revolver the robber named one after another the pals of Jerry Bohan and asked where they were. Bohan has confessed that he shot Monk Eastman and is now in jail awaiting trial. It was from the Court Cafe that Bohan, Eastman and others set forth on a drinking party that ended in Eastman's death in Fourteenth street a few months ago.

After the recent holdup in the cafe the police heard that the man who accomplished it was Herberger, and that he had gone to Philadelphia. He was arrested there by Detective Patrick Knowles and Capt. Dan Carey of the Thirtieth detective division, with the help of Philadelphia policemen, who surrounded a house in Wallace street and arrested Herberger. The woman proprietor of the house was arrested in Manhattan two years ago and imprisoned two months for violating the Sullivan law, the police say.

Two charges against Herberger are made in Philadelphia. He is accused of binding one George A. Second street jeweller of the name of Doherty in December last and carrying off jewelry worth \$20,000. He is also charged with picking the pocket of John Goldman in Market street on March 15.

### HOLY WATER QUEST LEADS TO ACCIDENT

Boy Run Down After Leaving Religious Ceremony.

Matteo Luckieggis, 9, left his parents' home at 9 Bleeker street, Mount Vernon, yesterday morning to go to the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel to procure a bottle of the holy water which had been blessed during the services. One of the priests gave him the water, and he started back home.

The child had gone but a few blocks when his anxiety to reach home caused him to run across Stevens avenue at Mount Vernon avenue. The next instant he was struck by an automobile and sent rolling across the pavement. His skull was fractured, and at Mount Vernon Hospital, where he was taken, it was said the injury might result in his death. Menlo Liccione of 100 Mount Vernon avenue, driver of the automobile, told the police he did not see the boy until he was almost under the wheels. It was then too late to turn the machine aside.
