REBEL ARMY OF 800 WIPED OUT, EL PASO LEARS

Herrera's Command Annihilated in Fight Near the Border, Report States.

VILLA IN CHIHUAHUA

Vanguard of Fugitives Reaches Texas Town—Herrera's Family Flees Capital.

El Paso, Tex., Dec. 8.—Gen. Maclovio Herrera, and 800 rebels were annihilated by the federals during a battle about twenty miles east of Gallesco, according to a report received here tonight. The wives went down after the report was received.

Although rebel headquarters deny the report there is much activity in the hospitals in Juarez and hurried preparations are being made to receive the wounded.

Herrera to Move Capital?

London, Dec. 8.—Agents of Herrera in this city are reported to have received notification today that Herrera intends to transfer the seat of government from Mexico City to Aguila, in Guerrero. This town is now held by the brigand Zapata, who has been fighting the federals for the last few days in Mexico.

Villa Enters Chihuahua City.

Juanes, Dec. 8.—Gen. Pancho Villa entered the city of Chihuahua today at the head of his troops, and formally declared the state in the possession of the constitutionalists.

Telegrams came tonight from Villa to the effect that he reached the state capital this morning and was warmly welcomed. He has pardoned the 200 federal soldiers who remained behind to guard the city.

News of the capture by rebels of a federal supply train carrying important news in Nuevo Laredo was received in Juarez today by Gen. Benavides from Gen. Carranza, at Hermosillo.

Herrera at Last Stated.

Mexico City, Dec. 8.—Finding the rebel forces generally pushing nearer to the capital on all sides, President Herrera appears to be preparing for his last desperate stand against his enemies.

Refugees Near Border.

Presidio, Tex., via United States Army Telephone to Dallas, Dec. 8.—The advance guard of the federal army reached Ojinaga this morning, taking the city without firing a shot, the rebel garrison under Col. Chirva having evacuated during the night making their escape to the northward.

Storm Kills Two in Gotham.

New York, Dec. 8.—Two men were killed and six others injured by a storm which struck this city today. A storm which blew down from the northwest, forcing down the temperature twenty degrees and putting a thin coating of ice on all standing water in the city.

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Cleveland Tied Up.

Cleveland, Dec. 8.—A fifty-mile-an-hour gale, accompanied by snow showers, and a drop in temperature, tied up shipping today, demoralized train traffic, brought suffering to hundreds of poor families, and will be responsible for at least one death.

UNCLE SAM COMES TO AID OF TEXAS FLOOD VICTIMS

Upon advice from Brig. Gen. Bliss, at San Antonio, Tex., rations for 2,000 and 1,000 blankets will be sent to Bryan, that State, for the relief of the flood victims there.

EUGENIC MARRIAGE CANDIDATE.

Atlanta Girl Would Claim Scintillating Seat From Priests.

Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 8.—Miss Roberta Brennan, a handsome society girl, has offered herself as Atlanta's candidate for the ideal eugenic marriage, which is being arranged by the Medical Review of Reviews Sociological Fund. The ideal man and woman selected are to receive a \$500,000 annuity to marry. When the first baby is born the couple thus essentially mated are to receive another \$500,000.

She has never been ill in a day in my life," said Miss Brennan, "and I think it my duty that the man I marry be as sound physically as I am. The eugenic marriage appeals to me as desirable, especially as regards offspring. It is not necessary to marry a healthy man and woman cannot become intimately acquainted without being drawn to each other."

FORTY MORE DIE IN TEXAS FLOODS

Scores Are Missing and Pestilence Breaks Out in Torrent-swept Districts.

Galveston, Tex., Dec. 8.—Forty lives are known to have been lost in the flooded district today. Unofficial reports say that many more have perished during the last twelve hours. Because of the high waters and the interruption to means of communication detailed figures are impossible, but it is believed that fully 500 have been lost since the floods began. Twenty were drowned while the great flood struck Brookshire today. Three members of a recruiting party were drowned at Bryan. At Sunnydale, twelve were drowned and twenty-eight are missing. Three lost their lives at Winton, and two are known to be lost at Richmond. The great of the flood reached Richmond this evening, marooning 1,800 persons on a small island. The suffering throughout the district is appalling.

1,800 MAROONED ON ISLE

Government Sends Food and Tents to Sufferers—Perished May Reach 500.

The United States government sent a train of eleven cars carrying supplies to Bryan this afternoon. It is planned to establish a base of supplies in the flooded district and issue rations, tents, and blankets. The hospital in the supplies sent today were 2,000 rations, 500 blankets, and 200 tents.

EMPTY COFFERS BURIED.

Denver, Dec. 8.—With the bodies of forty blizzard victims awaiting burial, the city of Denver is facing a situation unprecedented in American cities. Although thousands worked on the streets today in an effort to open passageways for vehicles, but little progress was made in removing the great quantities of snow, and it was announced that it will be impossible to hold any funeral for at least a week. The bodies of the dead lie in their homes, unremoved to all, included in the responsibility of undertakers to reach them to the residential districts.

WARNS U. S. FROM GUATEMALA

Mary Louise Ferris Off to Tell Story to Indianapolis Court.

Stripped of her veil of mystery and no longer playing the role of innocents which marked her confinement in the House of Detention, Mary Louise Ferris, alias "Susan Meyers," last night left for Indianapolis, where she will be forced to tell what part she played in an alleged fake matrimonial scheme worked with scientific financial success in Princeton, Ind.

HER MASK IS REMOVED

Seeing Extradition Cannot Be Avoided She Seeks Police for Her Arrest.

Accompanied by her attorney Matthew O'Brien and two deputy marshals, William Robertson, of Washington, and Jack Travis, of Indianapolis, the Ferris girl left the Capital at midnight. District Attorney Clarence H. Wilson yesterday received a letter from District Attorney Miller, of Indianapolis, enclosing two photographs of the girl and asserting that she had been indicted by the federal grand jury under the name of "Susan Meyers." Attorney O'Brien carried up a Washington message yesterday morning, but Justice Job Barnard in Criminal Court, No. 1, delayed the case until District Attorney Wilson received the letter from District Attorney Miller.

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MILITANTS SET CHURCH AFIRE.
