THE KENTUCKY ELECTION.

There were several hundred pardon seekers thronging the Presidential mansion all day Saturday. The city is filled with those of the twenty thousand dollar stamp, and the daily arrivals are greatly in excess of the departures.

The Post-Office Department is in receipt of quite a number of remittances from parties who have yielded to postmasters at the time of accession, but a still larger number very coolly write the Department asking for payment of balances due them for postal service rendered the United States up to the period of rebellion.

There were 3,878 acres taken up at Lacrosse, Wisconsin, for actual settlement, last month, under the Homestead Law.

The census of 1860 represents 33 book-binding establishments in the New-England States in that year, with an invested capital of \$119,750; employing 219 men and 338 female hands; paying for material \$206,699; for labor, \$149,732, and yielding products annually to the amount of \$194,765.

The amount of National Currency issued by the Treasury Department during the week ending the 9th inst., was \$2,404,306, and the total amount up to that date, \$174,981,520.

The receipts from Internal Revenue on Saturday amounted to \$539,000.
