The entire island was thickly populated. Many of the inhabitants worked on the mainland, at Kagoshima, which is the center of the famous Satsuma pottery industry.

Formerly the whole territory was included in the province of Satsuma, but several years ago, when the island of Shikoku was redivided, Kagoshima and Sakurashima were included in the province of Kagoshima. The island is about 60 miles southeast of Tokyo.

When the earthquake began last Saturday, coming in rapid succession, the people were panic-stricken, and hundreds of them went to the mainland. Thousands of men, women and children, however, remained on the little island, and when the big eruption started they were overwhelmed with lava and showers of fire and ashes.

Peruvian Seaport Hit by Tidal Wave

LIMA, Peru, Jan. 12.—Callao, the principal seaport of Peru, was inundated by a tidal wave, accompanied by an earthquake, lasting fifty seconds. No loss of life is reported.

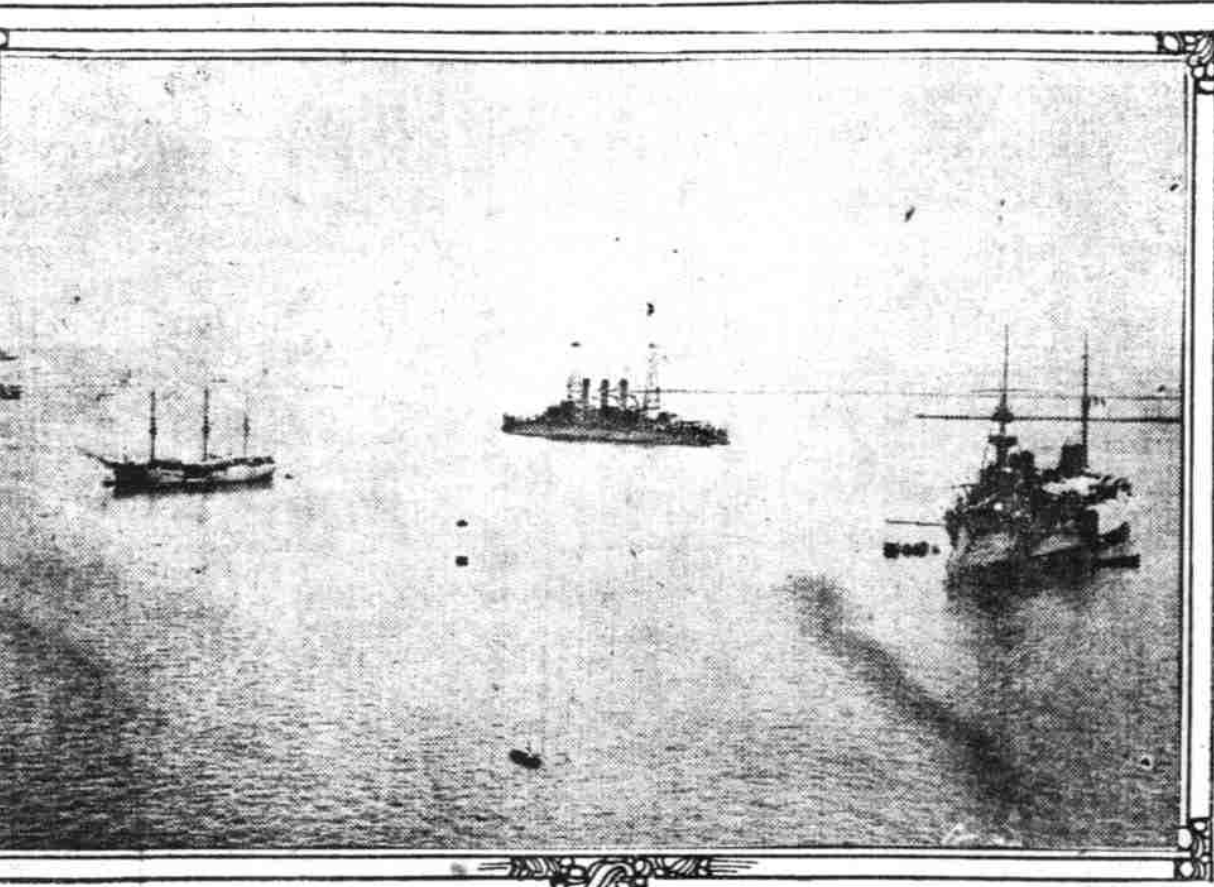
House Will Decide On Calumet Saturday

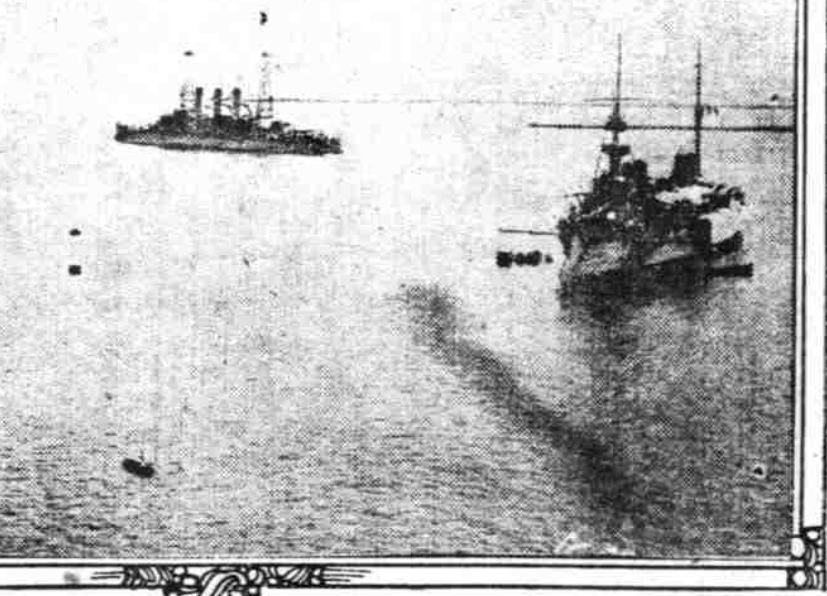

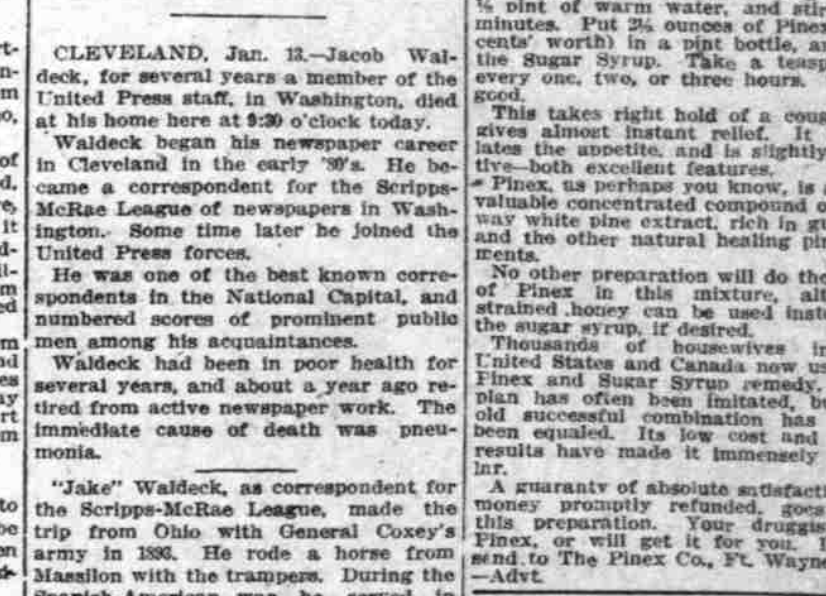
