TOURNAMENT RULES REACH WASHINGTON

Dates for Individuals to Be Arranged for Their Best Convenience.

For the information and guidance of teams and individuals entering the A. B. C. tournament, which begins in Buffalo next month, the following rules and regulations covering all games rolled in the series have been sent to the various cities invited to participate.

Bowlers entered in all three events will be scheduled so as to permit them to complete competition within two days, unless they are doubled with some one who is bowling on another team at the same time.

Special dates will be granted when possible. When alleys are filled on special dates, the nearest open date will be given.

No entry money will be returned after being received.

Efforts will be made to roll the five-man teams in the evening, with doubles and singles the following day.

Individuals are requested to give business addresses.

All entries will be received in accordance with the rules of the league.

In the two-men contest one substitute will be allowed.

Each high school team would play twelve games with the other high school teams instead of four as is now the case.

Teams and individuals must bowl three games on the set of alleys in scheduled order.

Every bowler entered in the individual event must have at least one ball for his personal use.

No rosin or foreign substance will be allowed on alleys, runways or for use on a ball or on a bowler's foot.
