

### Aliens Try to Spread Sedition At Ellis Island

**Reds Held for Deportation Attempt to Hold Meetings of Immigrants and Make Speeches on Bolshevism All Are Now Segregated**

**Kept Under Guard at All Times, Even at Meals, Says Official Statement**

Efforts by alien anarchists, I. W. W. and Bolsheviki awaiting deportation at Ellis Island to spread red propaganda among immigrants at the station were set at naught by Commissioner of Immigration Frederic C. Howe and his assistants, it was said at Ellis Island yesterday. Assistant Commissioner B. H. Uhl denied, however, publisher reports that a plot was found to smuggle seditious literature into the country. The alien reds, it was discovered, made several efforts to address mass meetings of immigrants, but were segregated and are being kept under close guard, Mr. Uhl said. "Alien deportees who were placed with other immigrants because of lack of room at the island," said he, "made attempts to hold meetings at which they sought to preach their doctrine. They were immediately segregated and their actions are being watched. Their mail is censored and they are not permitted to remain alone, even at meal hours. All their papers were examined and no seditious literature has been discovered among them."

Mr. Uhl deprecated the reports that seditious literature is being smuggled into the country. The government officials, he said, are keeping too close a watch upon the situation to permit anything of the kind to happen.

### Radicals Ask \$100,000 To Defend Their Ideas

**Fund Is Planned to Fight the Lusk Committee and Other Bodies Probing Bolshevism**

A campaign to raise \$100,000 for the dissemination of propaganda in defence of Socialist institutions was launched yesterday at the People's House, 7 East Fifteenth Street. Radicals contemplate using most of this fund to combat the Lusk committee and other official bodies engaged in attempting to prevent the spread of Bolshevism. It was announced that a committee is preparing to print and distribute at least 50,000,000 pamphlets explaining the radicals' case. Thousands of letters were sent out to radicals and labor organizations yesterday, asking for aid. These communications brand the recent raid on the Rand School as a "Cossack invasion" and assert that it is necessary to raise \$100,000 for the defence of the "fundamental rights of freedom" and for the "defence of the thousands who now languish in jail because they dared to think."

### MacMillan to Have Iceproof Ship for Long Arctic Trip

PORTLAND, Me., July 21.—Donald B. MacMillan, leader of the Crocker Land expedition, will be provided with a small schooner with auxiliary power, to be christened the Bowdoin, when he leaves next summer on his next Arctic exploration trip, according to plans of the alumni of Bowdoin College. MacMillan is a member of the Bowdoin faculty, as well as a graduate of the college.

The schooner will be built to withstand the pressure of icefloes. The party, about ten in number, will devote two or three years in exploration work for the National Geographic Society.

### State Department 'Leak' Still Being Investigated

**Peace Mission in Paris Asked About Code Message Sent to House by Bullard**

WASHINGTON, July 21.—The investigation of how "The Nation" procured the code message sent by Under Secretary of State Polk to Colonel House, in which the views of Arthur Bullard, of the Committee on Public Information, about the Russian situation were detailed, has not been completed by the State Department, it was admitted here to-day.

It also was declared at the State Department that a complete report of the inquiry made to determine how Max Eastman received the copy of a State Department code message, which he read at a public meeting in New York, has not yet been received by the department.

It is understood that investigation has disclosed that the "leak" of these code messages did not occur in the State Department here, and that a request has been sent to the American Peace Mission in Paris to endeavor to ascertain where the documents originated.

### Algeria Governor to Quit

**Jonnart Asks To Be Relieved for French Reconstruction**

PARIS, July 21.—Senator Charles Jonnart in a letter addressed to Premier Clemenceau and the people, asked to-day that his commission as Governor of Algeria be not renewed. His term will expire on July 22.

Recalling that he had accepted the Algerian mission only for the duration of the war, M. Jonnart in his letter said he wishes to give his time and strength to the restoration of the Artois district which he represents in the Senate and to help his countrymen who were victims of the war's disasters.

M. Jonnart was reported Saturday to be slated to succeed M. Louchet in the Clemenceau Cabinet as Minister of Industrial Reconstruction.

### Dozen Women Held Arrested in Raid by Military Police

MINEOLA, L. I., July 21.—A dozen women taken in various raids made by county detectives and military police yesterday were held under bail to-day to answer charges of disorderly conduct. A woman known as Grace Durkin was arrested after her home had been surrounded by the military police under Captain Busch. Several soldiers were found there.

Wright's Hotel, at Belmont Park, also was visited. John Boston and eight women were arrested. A man found there was a deputy sheriff. He was dismissed by Sheriff Seaman to-day. The sheriff declined to give his name.

### Spanish Cabinet Approved

PARIS, July 21.—Havas—in commenting upon the formation of the new Spanish Cabinet, the Paris newspapers are a unit in pointing out that Joaquin Sanchez Toca, the Premier, and the Marquis de Lema, the new Foreign Minister, are old and sincere friends of the Entente. It is predicted by "Le Journal" that Spain's foreign policy, under this Ministry, will be altered in a way favorable to the Allies, and particularly to France.

Senator Lusk and Attorney General Newton were out of town yesterday. Mr. Newton was at Albany, where he consulted with Governor Smith in regard to calling an extra session of the legislature to enact legislation to curb the activities of the foreign language press. The evidence before the committee has indicated that the alien newspapers and magazines are being used almost entirely to spread Bolsheviki propaganda.
