

# P. O. MEN FIND ROOSEVELT BOMB CLUE

WATERTOWN N. Y., Feb. 23 (I.N.S.)—Postal inspectors today unearthed their first clue which they hope will lead them to discover the identity of the person who mailed a crude bomb to President-elect Roosevelt in Washington.

It was found that the infernal machine was mailed from this city at 11 p. m. Sunday. The package was picked up from the top of a United States mail box in front of a local chain grocery store by Mail Carrier Logan J. Hannay.

Hannay, unsuspecting what the package contained, remembered it because it was addressed to the President-elect.

The mail carrier placed it in his collection bag along with an assortment of other pieces of mail. It was cleared from the local postoffice, where it was postmarked, early Monday morning.

Officials investigating the second attempt on the life of the President-elect are working here quietly.

One theory held by them is that the person who sent the bomb came from some other city for the express purpose of mailing the package from here.

# PRIZES HASTEN WEDDINGS

ROME (I.N.S.)—The Fascist Federation at Novara is encouraging young people to marry, by giving 60 prizes worth 1,000 liras each (\$50) to Fascists who marry within the first six months of the new year.

Other provincial Fascist federations will follow Novara's example.

Rome, which is already offering 80 per cent reduction on railway transport for all honeymooners who visit the city from any part of Italy within two weeks of their marriage, will try to give free transport to the newlyweds, who get the 1,000 liras bonus.

# D. C. BODY HITS PAY RISE BAN

The District supply bill provision which prohibits automatic pay increases was scored last night in resolutions adopted by the Rhode Island Citizens Association.

It was pointed out that policemen, firemen and teachers, under existing law should receive \$100 yearly increases until they have reached the maximum salary. The prohibition of this increase is an injustice, it was said.

The association also endorsed the action of the Federation of Citizens Associations in disapproving the Radio Finance Corporation loan to the District for unemployment relief.

# Citizens Group Raps Police Tag Change

The purpose of the police department is the prevention of crime and not sneaking up on petty traffic culprits.

This is the essence of a resolution adopted last night by the Randle Highlands Citizens Association in which the proposed change of license tags on police cars was scored.

The association also urged restoration in the District supply bill of appropriations for incinerators and the testing laboratory of the Highway Department.

Howard University alumni, through a national committee, is sponsoring a movement to present on charter day, next Thursday, a portrait of Dean Kelly Miller to the university as the first to be hung in a hall of fame to be established by the alumni at the institution.
