ONE HUNDRED YEARS OLD First Presbyterian Church Soon to Celebrate Its Birthday. SISTER CHURCHES TO ASSIST

Meeting To-night of the Congregation to Discuss Ways and Means. Oldest Presbyterian Organization in the City—Early Worshipers Used a Building at the White House.

A very important meeting of the session of the First Presbyterian Church will be held this evening. Its object will be to discuss the ways and means of celebrating the centennial celebration of that church.

ON A GRAND SCALE. Dr. Sunderland favors the celebration on the proposed grand scale and he spoke very interestingly on the subject to a Times reporter last night.

When the carpenters began their part of the work they had their own quarters and as well as can be ascertained they formed a religious assembly of the Presbyterian faith in November, 1795.

Up to this time, said Dr. Sunderland, the church was what might be termed a wandering or nomadic institution and they were next heard of in the room of the supreme court, in the Capitol.

At any rate, said Dr. Sunderland, if one were to dig down on the site of the old building he would strike the old walls. The story of this church was related to Dr. Sunderland by the daughter of the late John White.

HE BECAME THE PASTOR. In 1853 Dr. Sunderland became the pastor of the church. Most of the history of the old church has been collected by Dr. Sunderland from people who were children at the time of the events he relates.

Another source of information was Mrs. Underwood, wife of John Underwood, who lived on New Jersey avenue, nearly opposite the present location of the Coast and Geodetic Survey.
