The candidates for the team are numerous and of excellent quality. They will all take a course of indoor exercise and training immediately after the Christmas vacation.

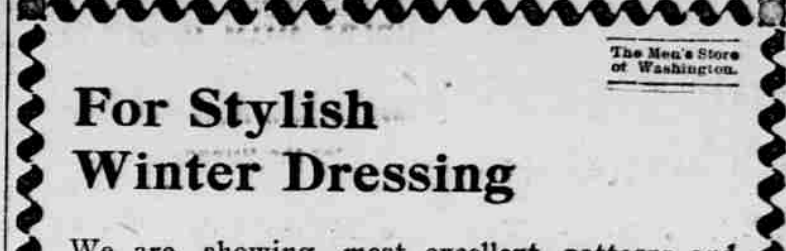
The team promises to be as strong as last season's mighty team, a remarkable promise to make, many will say, but from the present outlook it will continue to pass.
