

THE COUNTY STIRS EUROPE

Gulchowski's Prophecy of War Makes Statesmen Ponder.

EUROPE AGAINST AMERICA

British Foreign Office Much Distracted Over the Recent Seizure of Chinese Territory by Germany—Arranging a Private Deal to Obtain Concessions for Defense.

London, Nov. 27.—Count Gulchowski, Austrian minister of foreign affairs, has given great prominence recently among European statesmen, chiefly by reason of the concentration of the Austro-Hungary states, which is almost solely to his skill. No recent utterance of any public man in Europe has attracted so much attention as his address the other day to the Hungarian Parliamentary delegation, in which he discussed the general European situation.

It was a clear cut, masterly statement; it set forth the foreign policy of Austria-Hungary, but by far the most important and significant portion of the speech was the concluding sentences in which Count Gulchowski prophesied a great economic war between Europe and America. The attention, which his words are attracting throughout Europe, is additional proof of their significance, and under the circumstances scarce a man in America will not fail to give them the consideration they deserve.

SUICIDE CLUB'S VICTIM

Young Walter J. McBride Draws the Fatal Number.

INSANITY FOLLOWS THE ACT

Thirteen Members Formed the Club, Five of Whom Have Died by Their Own Hand—One Victim Was Howard Cranston Potter, a Nephew of Bishop Potter.

San Francisco, Nov. 27.—The Pacific Mail steamer Pacific, which arrived from Honolulu today, brings an interesting story about Walter J. McBride, paying teller of Bishop & Company's Bank, and a young society man, who has become insane, it is said, through drawing the fatal number in a suicide club, which he joined about six years ago in Seattle. According to the story, McBride received his summons to take his life this month, following in the footsteps of five other members of the club. A letter giving the name of the club had been received by friends of McBride residing in this city. McBride drew the fatal number, but had twelve months in which to kill himself. The matter weighed so heavily on his mind that his reason became unbalanced, and through his strange actions and nightly ravings his friends learned the truth. He is being cared for by friends in Honolulu, and it is supposed that he does not carry out his purpose, which was the real motive of the suicide. The club was formed, and each of the thirteen members took a solemn oath to follow out its objects. Lots were drawn that night, and within twenty-four hours thereafter one member was dead by his own hand. Since then other members have felt in honor bound to keep their oaths, and each year a victim has succumbed until five have been laid away. In not one case was the death accidental, and in each case the motive was the same. One of the victims was Howard Cranston Potter, a nephew of Bishop Potter, of New York, whose body was found on the sands below the Cliff house in San Francisco, a year ago. McBride returned to Honolulu, of which place he is a native, about four years ago, and secured a position in Bishop & Company's bank, where he rose to paying teller. He made considerable money in sugar stocks, and he was known as a high road property, when the summons to die came. That was a year ago, but through the unanimous action of the surviving members of the club, Walter had a year's respite, but this month he was to have committed suicide.

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TWO MEN KILLED IN VIENNA

Fatal Results Attending Reichsrath's Disgraceful Riots.

THE SOLDIERS ORDERED OUT

A Mob of Thirty Thousand People Gather in the Streets After Herr Wolf is Dragged from the Chamber by the Police to the House of Detention.

Vienna, Nov. 27.—Long before the hour of opening today's sitting of the Reichsrath the streets in the neighborhood of the Parliament building and the chamber itself were filled by the police in strong force. When Premier Abrahamovics and Premier Eucken entered the chamber they were greeted with cheers by their adherents and an uproar of insults, jeers and insulting epithets by the opposition. Herr Wolf, the leader of the rioters, made his appearance in the chamber in spite of the fact that he had been arrested yesterday and confined to the House for three days. As soon as he appeared he was seized by eight policemen, who dragged him outside. He made as much resistance as possible, and continued his struggles outside the chamber. The police finally declared him under arrest, and dragged him to the House of Detention.
