A VERDICT AGAINST FUNK

The Jury Reaches a Conclusion After a Long Deliberation.

The Prisoner Loses Self-Control When the Decision Is Announced—Notice Given the Court That a Motion for a New Trial Will Be Made—Murder of W. H. Brooks Reviewed.

Frank W. Funk has been found guilty of the murder of William H. Brooks on June 23, 1928. The jury reached a verdict after seventeen and one-half hours' deliberation, and announced the result in Criminal Court No. 1 yesterday morning.

The Prisoner Visibly Affected. He was pale and haggard, and trembled visibly; the brightness of his steel-grey eyes was gone, and the flashing glances which were so noticeable during the first days of the trial were not seen as he faced the jury as they entered the courtroom and took their seats in the jury box.

AT THE NATION'S MUSEUM

A Number of Improvements Which Will Soon Be Completed.
