Direct Primary Doomed and Alteration of Ballot to Permit Straight Ticket Among Reforms Expected

Republican state leaders close to Governor-elect Nathan L. Miller say that they will include the restoration of nominating conventions for state and judicial nominees; abolition of the convention committee on credentials; alteration of the ballot so that a cross in a circle under a party emblem will permit of voting a straight ticket, but with the names so arranged as to facilitate splitting the ticket, and vesting in the courts the disposition of contests over delegates' rights to sit in convention.
