Social Welfare Post

New Department Would Include Public Health and Hygiene Services

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—Creation of a department to coordinate and promote the social welfare of the people of the United States is provided for in a bill prepared by Senator Frank P. Blair, Jr., of Missouri, and the chief of the department would be a member of the Cabinet.

The new department would have jurisdiction over the public health, the health services and the hygiene laboratory now under the Treasury, the Bureau of Education from the Department of the Interior, the Children's Bureau, Women's Bureau, the Bureau of Industrial Hygiene and Transportation, the United States Employment Service, the Commission on the Labor Department, and the office of Home Economics from the Department of Agriculture.

J. J. Ryan Dies After Illness He Contracted in War

Youngest Son of Thomas F. Ryan Was Noted for His Skill as Motorist; Took Ride 3 Days Before End

Joseph J. Ryan, youngest son of Thomas Fortune Ryan, died last night in his apartment at the Hotel Ansonia. He had been lying at the hotel since his return from France, about eighteen months ago. While overseas he contracted rheumatism and a nervous affection.

He was thirty-three years old and was married in Baltimore, January 18, 1910, to Miss Eunice Morse, daughter of Alexander Porter Morse, an attorney in Washington.

His death occurred about 8 o'clock today, almost to the hour, since his return from the first long motor trip his physician had permitted him to take since his demobilization.

In the last few weeks his condition showed such improvement that he set out in his motor car Sunday evening. It was twenty-four hours later that he returned. The next morning he suffered a severe relapse.

Dr. Arthur Wright and Dr. Delmar Thompson were with him throughout, with several nurses. His condition became hopeless yesterday.

Mr. Ryan had been engaged in the automobile business for several years. He was in the motor car industry in New York City when he was in charge of the Bureau of Motor Vehicle Registration.

H. M. Wilson, Engineer and Insurance Man, Dies

Columbia Graduate Was in Charge of Bureau of Mines From 1916 to 1914

HARTFORD, Conn., Nov. 25.—Herbert H. Wilson, general manager of the Associated Insurance Companies and a former chief engineer of the United States Bureau of Mines, died in Hartford today, after a long illness, at his home, 450 Park Street.

Mr. Wilson was born in Glasgow, Scotland, sixty years ago. He was graduated from Columbia University in 1901, and spent some time in Mexico on railway engineering projects.

He held several positions in the United States Geological Survey and was in charge of the Bureau of Mines from 1910 to 1914.

He retired from service at Seawick, Pa., and came here when he was made general manager of the Associated Insurance Companies two years ago. He was the author of many articles on engineering.
