

Pier Service Held for 1,609 Soldier Dead

Major General O'Ryan and Full Staff Attend and Prayers Are Offered by Clergymen of All Faiths

Heroes' Relatives Present

Flag Draped Coffins Will Be Sent to Homes, Each With a Guard of Honor

The bodies of 1,609 Americans, who died fighting in France, ranged row after row in coffins draped with American flags, were paid military honors yesterday at the Army Transport Service Pier in Hoboken, where they had been landed from the transport *Somme*, which conveyed them home.

The ceremony was brief. The military service for the dead was carried through with Major General O'Ryan and his full staff in attendance. Prayers were offered by clergymen representing all faiths.

In the center of the pier seats had been erected for relatives of the dead, and grouped about the pier were detachments from National Guard regiments of New York City. On the rostrum were the attending clergy. Major General O'Ryan and former officers of the 27th and 30th divisions. An honor guard paced between the rows of caskets during the religious ceremony.

Were New York Men
All the bodies were from cemeteries in the battle zones of France and Belgium. They will be forwarded to various parts of the United States. Two hundred and ninety-two of the bodies were those of New York men. Three hundred bodies were of the 30th Division.

A naval band played "Nearer, My God, to Thee" while the hundreds assembled at the pier stood with bare heads. The opening address was made by Rabbi Levi S. Lehrman, formerly chaplain of the 27th Division. Father Peter Hoey, also a one-time overseas chaplain of the division, followed by the Rev. Herbert Shimman, pastor of the Church of the Heavenly Rest. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Frank Hanscom.

After the prayer service the command "Attention!" was heard and the marching troops came to present arms, while a bugler sounded taps.

Units Represented
The bodies of the 27th Division were thirty-seven of the 105th Infantry, forty-eight of the 107th Infantry, forty-nine of the 108th Infantry, one of the 109th Infantry, two of the 110th Infantry, one of the 112th Infantry, one of the 102d Field Signal Battalion and sixteen of undetermined units of the division. There were also five bodies of the 165th Infantry, 42d Division, thirty-six of the 77th Division and a number of bodies of men belonging to other combat divisions.

The bodies will be delivered by the Graves Registration Service to relatives and a special guard of honor will attend each interment.

Jellicoe's Plea for Far East Fleet Admitted in Commons

LONDON, March 16.—Premier Lloyd George, in the House of Commons today, in response to a question confirmed the report that Admiral Viscount Jellicoe, now Governor of New Zealand, in his report after his visit to Australia, asked for a Far Eastern fleet of the latest type. This, Admiral Jellicoe advised, should consist of eight battleships, eight battle-cruisers, ten light cruisers, forty destroyers and thirty-six submarines, to be provided by 1924. The Premier added that the dominions were deferring their views on the subject until the whole question of the naval policy for the empire comes up in June at the imperial conference.

U. S. Asks Spain to Alter Law Taxing Foreign Corporations

WASHINGTON, March 16.—Diplomatic representations requesting a modification of the Spanish law of last April taxing foreign companies operating in that country have been made to the Spanish government, it was announced today at the State Department. Other countries have joined with the United States in the action.

The law has not yet been put into effect, it was explained, but it provides for taxation of foreign companies and banks having branches or agents in Spain on a percentage basis of the capital and profits of the home companies.

Spain Suspends Trade Treaties

MADRID, March 16.—Suspension of all commercial treaties in force at present was decided upon by the Spanish Cabinet yesterday, and they will continue inoperative until the new customs tariffs have been promulgated, it is stated here.

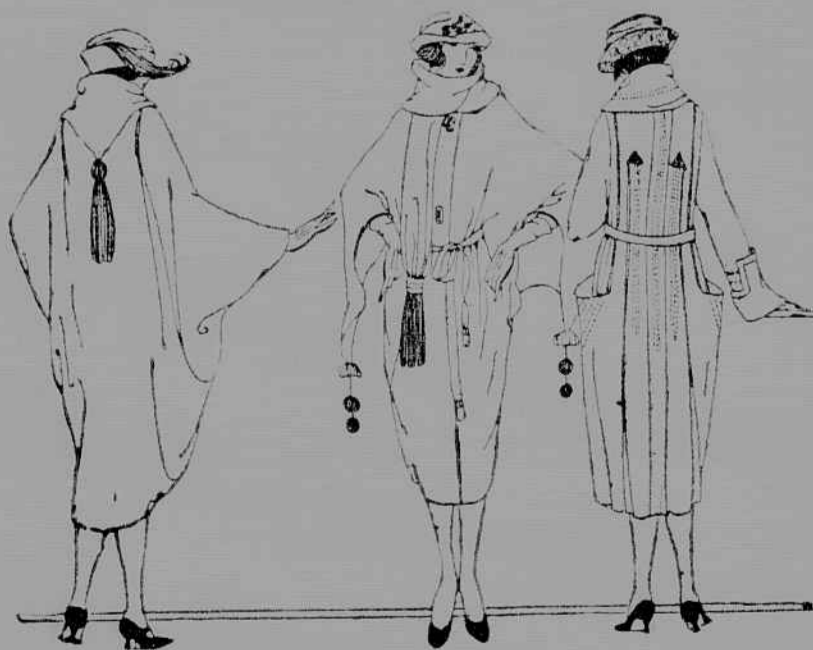

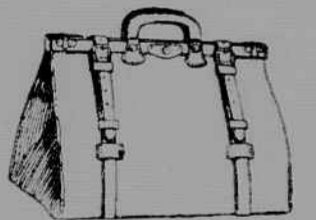
