EASTERN TACKLED BY WESTERN TODAY

Capitol Hill Lads and Boys From Georgetown Take the Field in Fifth Game.

Several New Men Likely To Be Seen in Contest For Red and White.

At Eastern they are sure that the eleven which walked off with the business team by a 13 to 0 score will defeat Western, which got away with a 1 to 0 game from Central...

None of the wisecracks are predicting a win for either team by a decisive score. The style of the eleven is practically the same as gleaned from the engagements thus far played...

Eastern will pin its faith on Greer, the giant center, to do the bulk of the defense work for the Light Blue and White. Greer's aggressiveness enabled Eastern to defeat Business...

Over at Western they have counted heavily on "Untz" Brewer, a sturdy young halfback, who will make his first appearance in high school football...

The teams will be about even in weight, and while Eastern has the more experienced eleven, Western is expected to go the limit for a win...

The probable line-up of the eleven with the officials for the game follows: Western—Pepper, Adams, Williams, Lanahan, Greer, Brady (Capt.), Farnsworth, Johnson, Pope (Capt.), Stackall, Eyer, Thorne, Riley, Dyer, Doxon.

Eastern took a 1 to 0 fall out of Western last year, the worst defeat of the Capitol Hill lads have ever suffered in the Red and White, and every effort will be made by the Western boys to even up for last year's beating.

Pepper, Brady, and Doxon are the only members of the Western team which opposed Eastern last year and the others watched the contest from the sidelines being ineligible to enter the contest on account of the first semester ruling.

Business and Central are meeting on Tuesday next the teams taking the field for their annual battle. Business has never beaten Central in football and thinks it has a chance this season.

Princeton Will Not Number Its Players

PRINCETON, N. J., Nov. 7.—The football coaches have reconsidered their intention to have the players in the game with Harvard on Saturday wear numbers. It was announced today that the matter had been dropped for this year.

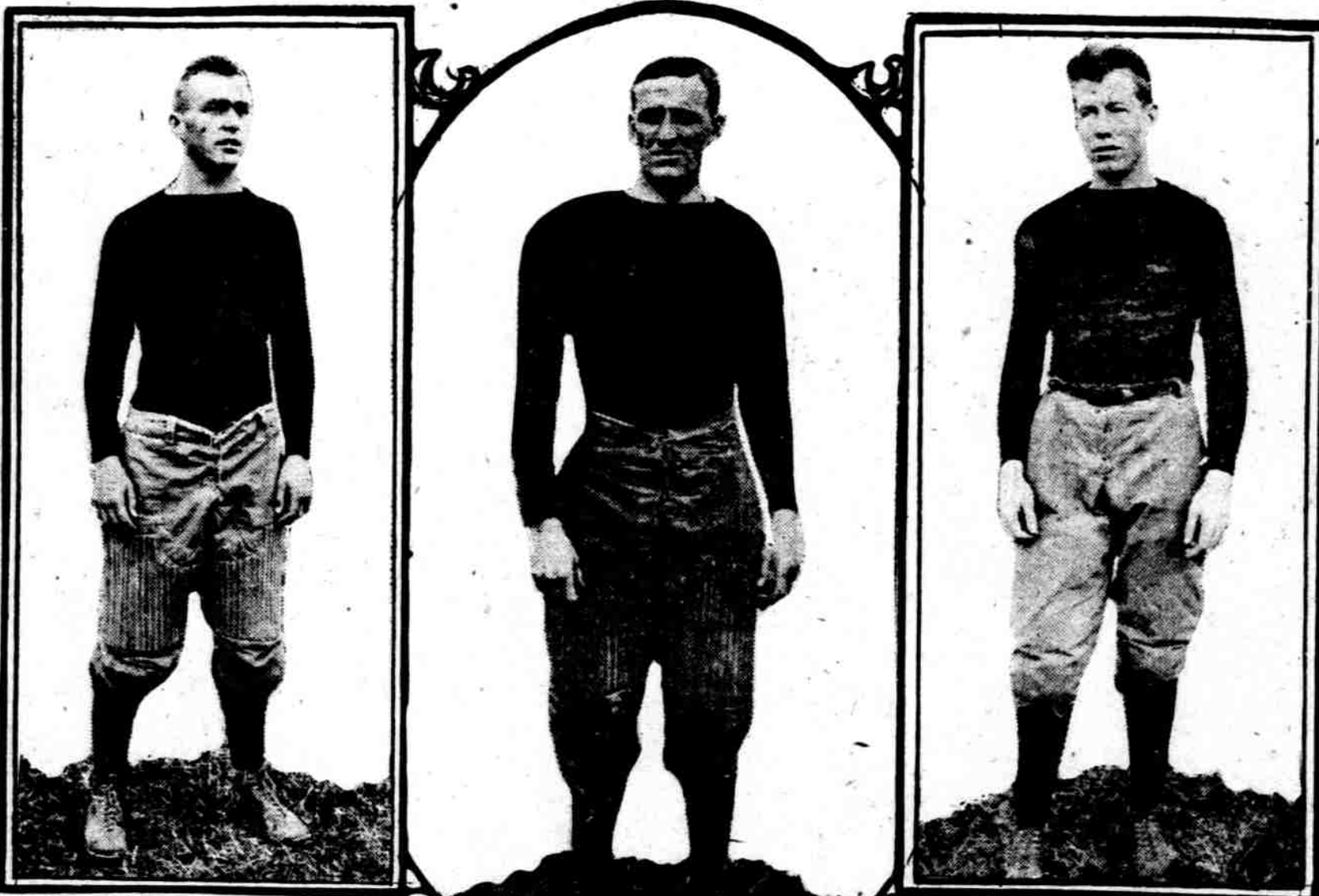
Cubs and Athletics Will Play a Series
