"Why should the motorists here be singled out to pay for the additional relief burden? I am definitely oppostd to such a proposition.


The fiscal affairs subcommittee chairman, however, said that he would be glad to call his group together to study the situation if the District Commissioners make a formal recommendation for increased taxes.




