WALTER JOHNSON, DOG MAN, KILLED

Tried to Protect Children From Wild Auto.

CROWD THREATENS DRIVER

Charges of Manslaughter and Intoxication Placed Against Schott.

TARRYTOWN, N. Y., June 15.—Walter Johnson, owner of the Elmford Kennel, on Mrs. Finley J. Shepard's estate, and one of the best-known fanciers in the country, was killed yesterday afternoon when an automobile, driven by a man accused of being intoxicated, ran into a crowd of children celebrating Flag Day in the village square in Elmford...

William Schott, driver of the automobile, tried to escape after tumbling over a score of children and knocking down Mr. Johnson, who tried to stop him. Several men jumped into automobiles and pursued Schott down the Tarrytown road...

However, he stopped at a roadhouse in Glenville, and when the pursuers came up they recognized his automobile and entered the barroom and setled him. The posse returned him to Elmford, where feeling was running high against him...

Under a heavy guard Schott was sent to the county jail at White Plains, it being feared that it would not be safe to keep him in the lock-up at Elmford. As he was being taken out of town for White Plains, with armed men standing on the running boards of the automobile to protect him, many threats were made against him...
