Nearly half of the women working in laundries, as clerks, as saleswomen, and as operatives at Printing...

Sixty-four per cent of all of such workers interviewed were making less than \$10 a week. No juvenile workers were included in the survey...

Little Spent on Clothes. Cases are cited of women who have been wage earners ten years and more who are getting \$5 to \$6.50 per week. In some cases the amount spent for clothing is as low as \$4 per year...

The poorest wages were found among the women in laundries. One in particular in this industry had been at work since she was nine years of age, and after twenty-five years of work finds herself earning \$5 per week...

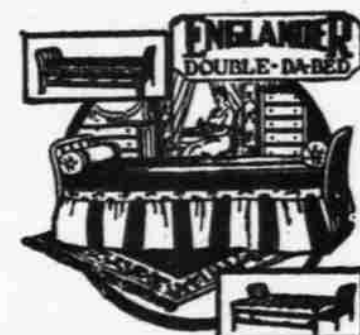
