

SEC. DANIELS WILL FORCE CLEAN UP OF PHILADELPHIA VICE

Secretary of the Navy Daniels today reiterated his determination to make Philadelphia safe for bluejackets and marines. He has ample powers, he declared, and unless the city authorities act upon his expose of vice and liquor conditions he will not hesitate to take drastic action.

It was learned today that Secretary Daniels complained to the Philadelphia authorities some time ago, but no action resulted. He then pressed his investigation and formally notified the authorities that conditions must improve, at the same time giving his finding to the press.
