Neary had been a member of the Ryan household for some months. The Ryans lived on the ground floor of the apartment house, which is owned by Miss Neary. Miss Neary occupied quarters alone on the third floor. Some weeks ago Ryan notified Peter Neary that the family was going to move and that in the new home there would be a room for him. As Neary had been unable to find employment and had been dependent on the Ryans for his shelter, he became moody at this announcement.

Man to Her Apartment

Anna Neary, who also was in the dining room directing Ryan's work, ran upstairs to her own apartment. She was followed by Peter, brandishing his revolver. She fumbled with the lock, her father overtook her and fired three shots at her, all of which took effect. Peter Neary, who stumbled into the apartment, followed by Peter, she succeeded in making her way to the rear of the house and over to the apartment of Mrs. Agnes Richardson, a sister.
