The Currency Sent to the Country Returning in Improved Collections.

Breadstuffs in Good Demand Early, but Close Quiet Weak.

FINANCIAL.

The settlements of the day were promptly met, and though not numerous were apparent in the business of the banks. The loan market was fairly active. As was to be expected, the movement of currency to the country during the past week has been favorable effect on collections. This is slight, but certain, and will soon become much greater. There is not a pressing number of applications for bank accommodations from the merchants, but the general demand for loans is as good as expected during the part of the season.

Rates of discount are 8 1/2 per cent to regular concerns. The possession of a considerable reserve still gives independent borrowers a considerable advantage in their dealings with the banks. The latter readily make such accommodations of several per cent on short-time paper.

New York exchange remains at 76c discount, as the banks are all under the necessity of drawing down their New York balances to meet the orders of their foreign correspondents.

There is an increasing flow of currency to the country, and, as the business of the railroads show, there is to be an unusually heavy shipment of grain to this point.

The clearings were \$1,800,000.

Mr. M. S. Stickney, for many years intimately associated with mining interests in Utah, arrived in Chicago yesterday direct from Salt Lake City. He reports the mines in Brigham and Dix Cañons doing a good business, and moving toward the development of their resources; but Mr. S. reports that in due time when it has changed owners it will again become productive and valuable.
