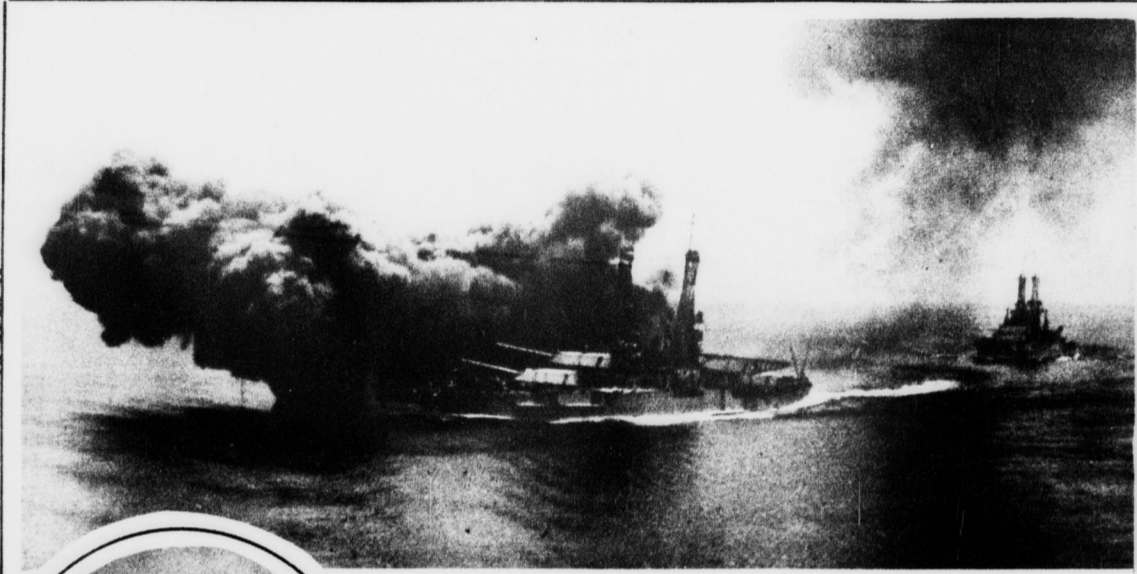
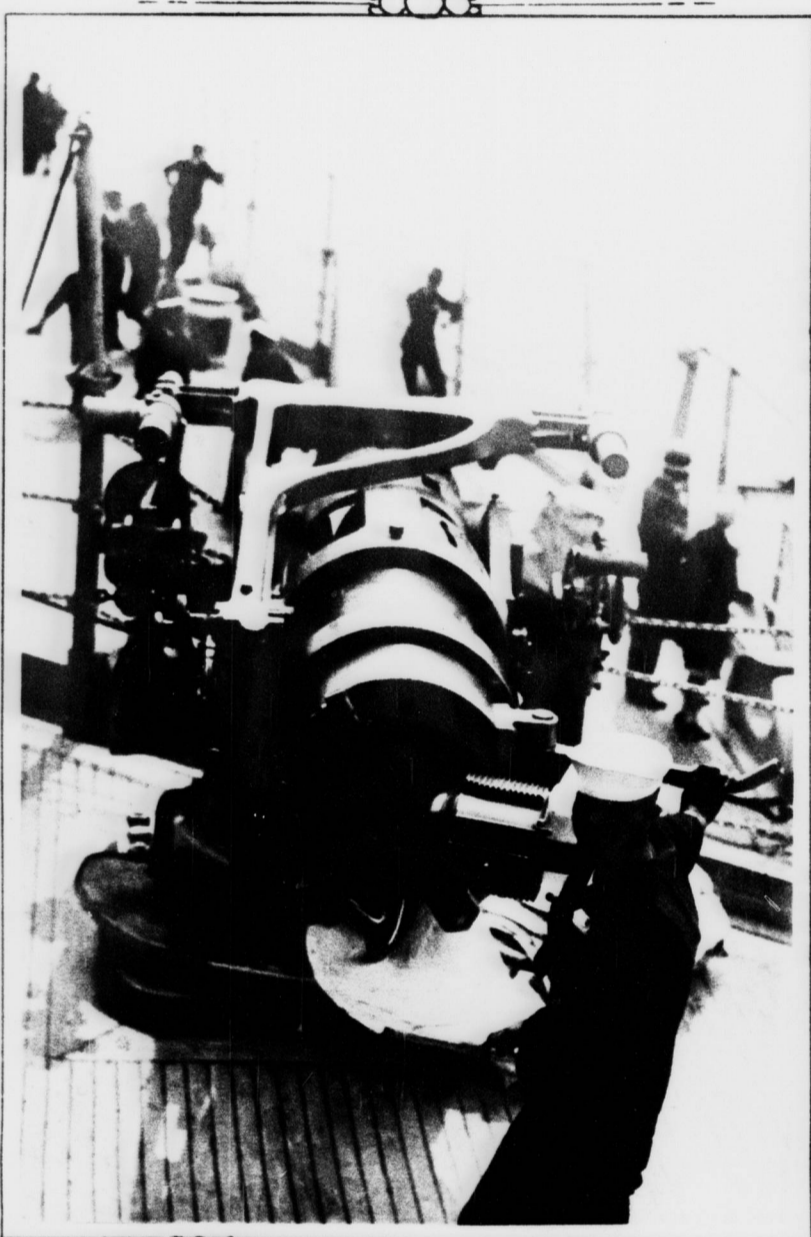
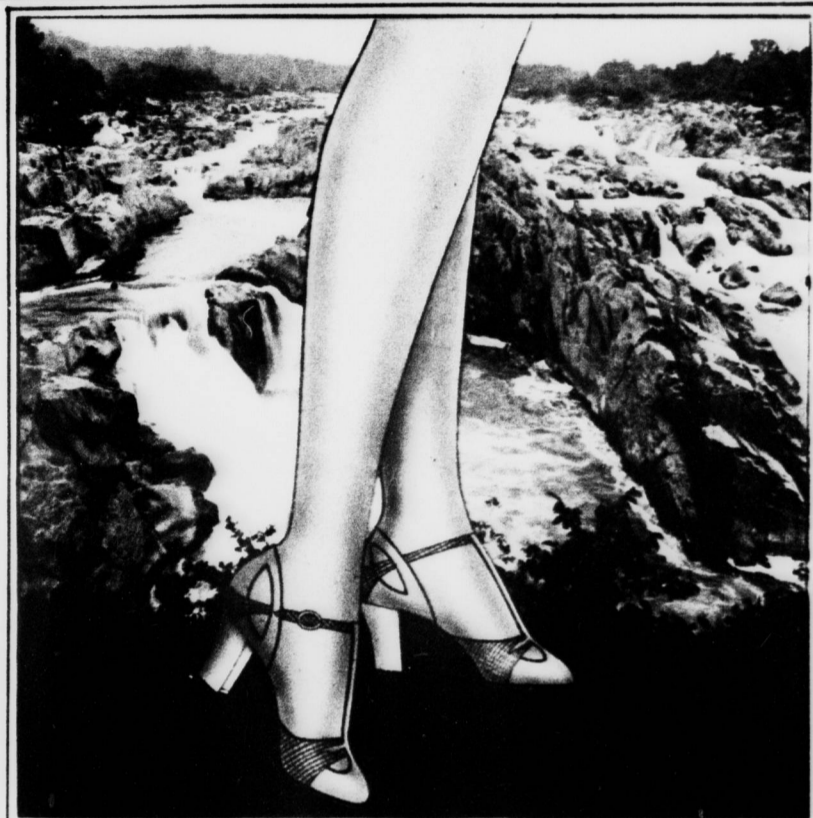

Uncle Sam's super-dreadnaught New Mexico "in action." An unusual photograph of target firing from the sea fighter's big guns.

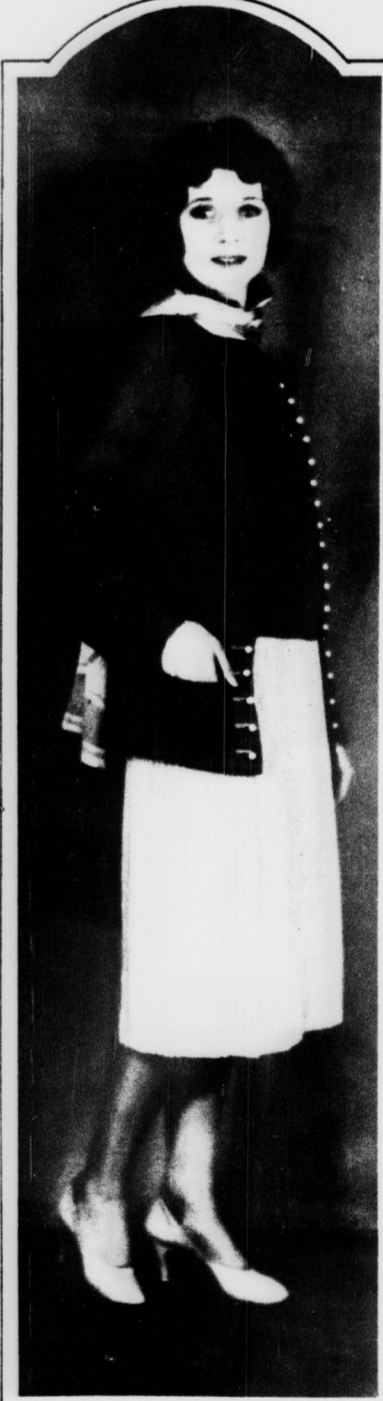

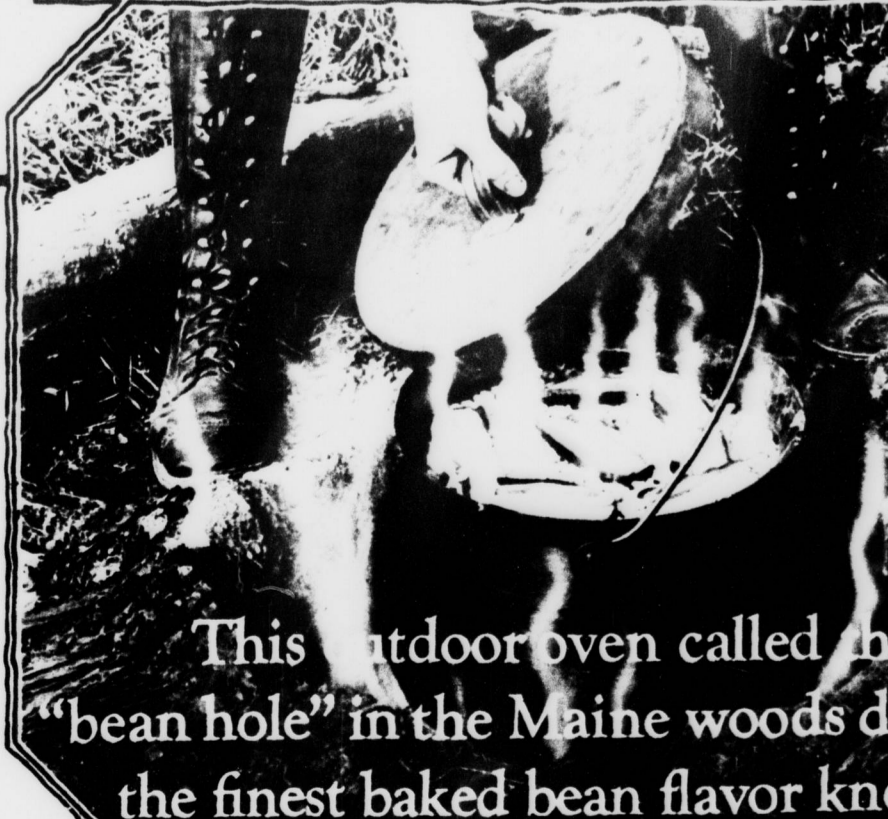
