

Great Britain Facing New Labor Crisis Due To High Price Regime

LONDON, Sept. 11.—A wet blanket has descended for the time being over the labor and industrial crisis which has faced England and which brought into the glare of daily publicity the plans of the "Reds" for revolution in Britain.

But England has not seen the end of this crisis. Its head will be raised again without doubt some weeks hence, breaking perhaps in a new guise and certainly over some new issue.

It is very difficult to adopt a sane and middle course in weighing and analyzing the situation, which has brought many conservative Englishmen into the open, and has placed the danger of "red revolutions." The situation is one of extremes. Many complications and of as many points of view as there are factions in England. And this is more than a mere complication; it is a complex situation through a long and quiet summer.

Only a matter of days ago the war was over and the country was shaking the dust of its own battles. The "wet blanket" which was supposed upon the troubled labor and industrial situation largely by manipulation in Downing street and the adjacent Whitehall district, is only a temporary phenomenon. The form which it took was a progressive move toward industrial reconstruction perhaps, but it didn't reach the cause of the unrest; it acted as a going providing a rest between rounds.

Prices were—and are—high; there were charges of profiteering; there were charges of unemployment; there were charges of wage disputes; there were charges of dissatisfaction with intervention in Russia and the continuance of the strike for coal, railway and shipping tie-up through strike for political ends by the Triple Alliance.

Official Count Gives Wells Big Lead Over Colored Opponent in Primary.

HYATTSVILLE, Md., Sept. 11.—George N. Wells, one of the successful candidates for Republican nomination for county commissioner in the primaries held Monday was unusually misrepresented by the statement in yesterday's Times—that he was defeated by his colored opponent, John E. Broadus, in the home district. The official count shows that Wells received seventy-three and Broadus eighteen votes in the Bladensburg district, where the registration books show Wells to be voted for. The mistake was due to the fact that Wells' postoffice address is Brentwood, which is located in the second precinct of Chillum district, where the vote was thirty-seven for Wells and forty-eight for Broadus.
