### Tone of Optimism Marks Conference; France to Reply Formally To-day

LONDON, Dec. 9. (By The Associated Press).—Premier Bonar Law caused a sensation at the second session of the Allied premiers this afternoon, when, in the course of his reply to M. Poincare's moratorium plan, he gave clear indication that the British government would be quite willing to reconsider the question of cancellation of the French debt, provided such a step was made possible by a reparations settlement satisfactory to Great Britain.

### Minor Changes Made

Minor changes were ordered by the committee, but for practical purposes the bill is as tentatively agreed to last evening. The Madden amendment for annual appropriations is out of the measure and the Willis compromise amendment is in. It requires appropriations be made only if the measure is passed by a majority of 11 to 5.
